# 26th Sunday of Ordinary Time ist October

#### **Holy Hour**

During his time as parish priest, Fr Gregory Pritchard established four main Holy Hours celebrated in the course of the year at St Joseph's. This is something I have tried to keep going during my time as priest of this parish.

Currently the four Holy Hours are:

Laetare Sunday (the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent) – probably chosen as an opportunity for the priest to look simply stunning, strolling down the centre aisle of the Church wearing rose-coloured vestments (they are not pink!)

Good Shepherd Sunday – held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter – an opportunity for the parish to pray for an increase of vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Corpus Christi – the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. In Australia this feast has been moved from its traditional date to the second Sunday after Pentecost. After many years of experience, I must say that it is safer to hold a Holy Hour in the Church on Corpus Christi rather than to brave the elements by trying to hold a Eucharistic Procession outside of the Church on the day.

The fourth and final Holy Hour held at St Joseph's occurs at the beginning of October. Although the reasoning behind the October Holy Hour was never written down, I have been able to formulate three explanations why this date was chosen by my illustrious predecessor.

1) It is a date close to the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The 7<sup>th</sup> October is the anniversary of the Battle of Lepanto – a victory attributed to Our Lady's intercessions won through the devout praying of the Rosary. In the life of the Church, the whole month of October is dedicated to the Rosary.

2) The month of October is also the month with a special focus on the life of marriage and the family. Marriage and the Family Sunday falls on the 22<sup>nd</sup> October this year, although it will probably be overshadowed by Catholic Mission's "Mission Sunday," which will be held on the same day.

3) I would also guess that the reason why October was chosen was to give the priest an opportunity to look stunning in a green cope and stole - one of the very few times that parishioners would see a priest so attired in the ordinary life of a parish.

Irrespective of the reason why the month of October was chosen for the fourth Holy Hour, there will be a 3pm Holy Hour held at St Joseph's Church on Sunday the 1<sup>st</sup> October. All are welcome!


