PARISH OF ST JOSEPH CHELSEA

27th Sunday of Ordinary Time 8th October

"I am the Good Shepherd; I know my sheep and my own know me." (Jn 10: 14)

Jesus Christ is the ideal role model that every Catholic priest looks up to and tries to imitate in his ministry. Since the 10th January 2018, when I first moved in to St Joseph's parish, I have desperately been trying to learn people's names.

At a recent parish pastoral council (PPC) meeting, the members of the PPC requested a list of "inactive" parish members (those who no longer come to regular Mass at St Joseph's). This is part of the PPC's efforts to try and increase the numbers of parishioners coming regularly to Mass.

In the search, I discovered that we do indeed have an "inactive" parishioner's file in the office. Sadly, all the people on it have died! (Apparently the only way you can leave St Joseph's parish is in a pine box!)

I than had to "reverse engineer" a new list. I asked our most excellent parish secretary, Maree Dalton, to print up the list of all the parishioners we currently have on file. This document spans 157 pages, each page with around 45 names. Now, unless arithmetic has changed since I was last at school, that is a grand total of 7,065 names on file. According to Governmental statistics, there should be over 10,000 baptised Catholics living within the Chelsea area. Our current Sunday Mass count is only 385 (from the count taken up during May 2023).

I know only a small fraction of people who appear in our parish records. So in the weeks ahead, please be aware that members of the PPC will be calling or door-knocking the parishioners whose names we have on file. The members of the PPC are: Paul Russell, Mary Alwyn, Rachel Alwyn, Margaret-Rose Durston, Vivian Chater, and Jeremy Dart. This is part of a pastoral outreach of the parish, catching up with parishioners, seeing how they are doing coming out of COVID lockdowns and restrictions (RUOK?), and checking if there is anything the parish can do for them at this time.

Hopefully through this initiative of the PPC, the Mass count at St Joseph's will increase significantly, and thus keep St Joseph's as a "viable parish" for many years to come, rather than being amalgamated with other parishes through the Way of the Gospel initiative.
