A RARE DISEASE JOURNEY—NIAMH AND MAREE DALTON—Part 2

Weeks of Lent Themes - Week 2 - Forgiveness, Community



Niamh continued to be tested for every known disorder, with results always coming back as negative. It was a very stressful time and I sought assistance for myself and my mental state through counselling. The first counsellor lasted one appointment after she said to me "I think you're spending too much time seeking a diagnosis. You should just love you child". Listen lady, I love my child with my whole being, hence my desire to find out what it is that is afflicting her so I can ensure we are on the right path for treatments – is what I thought, but didn't say! The second counsellor was much better, listening without judgement and occasionally throwing words of wisdom my way.

With no diagnosis for Niamh's condition, her Paediatrician recorded Autism, as Niamh was displaying some Autistic tendencies. Niamh continued to be a happy child, but now our days were spent in different therapies, seeing further specialists and undergoing more testing. Speech and Physio took up her days, and Niamh's medical team recommended a Specialist School for Niamh for pre-school. With waiting lists and the like, we were eventually able to get Niamh into Frankston Special Development school, in their 4 year old Kinder program.

Niamh was fitted with a soft top helmet, in order to protect her precious head in the event of a drop seizure. I remember a child in a line at a McDonalds asking me if "she played rugby", with that child's mother rather embarrassed and trying to move him away. But I told her that was okay, and gave said child a full lesson on epilepsy and what that looked like!

A full psychological assessment was completed on Niamh in August 2012, as she neared the end of the Kinder program at Frankston. This was done in conjunction with her Paediatrician, who pointed out that regression in abilities was now becoming a concern for Niamh. This, of course, was no surprise to myself, Jane and Mark, as we watched my darling girl lose some words, fail in fine motor skills and struggle to walk. A Vineland Assessment was completed with the following findings:

Significant delays in motor skills
Significant language delays
Significant safety concerns due to no awareness of dangers
Full assistance for self-care
Full adult support for education
Niamh has a global developmental delay with regression after onset of seizures

Recommendation of Specialist School with specialised teaching, therapists and equipment, and specialised medical care

With these results in hand, I was able to get Niamh into The Nepean School at Seaford for Prep 2013. This is a special school for children with disabilities who also suffer from severe health impairments. I cannot speak highly enough of the dedicated teachers, aides, therapists and personal care attendants who dedicate themselves to children like Niamh.

Niamh was prescribed a large amount of medications to attempt to reduce the seizure activity, comprising of 7 tablets in the morning, 8 in the evening, a special Ketogenic diet (high fat, low protein and carbs), and CBD. She is still on all of these today. Some improvement, yes, with seizures reducing in numbers and severity, but unfortunately, not eliminating them.

2013 proved to be a very difficult year, as we lost my father at the way too young age of 65 very suddenly in June. Dad is forever missed by us all.
