## PARISH OF ST JOSEPH CHELSEA

## Advent 4th Sunday A 18th December 2022

Where are we?

We are now working "over time!" This is part four of what was originally intended as a three part reflection, pausing during Advent, and reviewing what changes have happened in the parish during the upheaval of COVID restrictions and lockdowns. And the final change that will be explored is in regards to Eucharistic Exposition.

The liturgical program I inherited from Fr Pritchard was that a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Exposition (without Benediction) would take place every Saturday morning after the 9am Mass while confessions were being held. In addition, a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Exposition which concluded with Benediction would take place at 3pm on four Sundays throughout the course of the year, namely: Laetare Sunday – the fourth Sunday of Lent; Good Shepherd Sunday – the fourth Sunday of Easter; the Feast of Corpus Christi – which in Australia has been moved to the Second Sunday after Pentecost; and finally, on the Sunday closest to the 7<sup>th</sup> October – to celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

During the more draconian COVID restrictions, the Church had to be cleaned after every service, and names of the ten, twenty, thirty, or fifty participants had to be recorded. In consequence, for about two and a half years it was not viable to hold individual times of Eucharistic Exposition in the parish – as Exposition required as much work to conduct as a Sunday Mass, and people were yearning to physically receive the Eucharist rather than just spend time gazing at it. So since the dreaded year of 2020, most Eucharistic Exposition has occurred prior to the celebration of Mass, or has been held while confessions have taken place. As I explained a couple of weeks ago – the priest should never be in a position where he records the names of the people receiving the sacrament of confession. However, the priest can record the names of people attending Eucharistic Adoration (whether they attended confession or not is known by God – and the penitent – alone!).

For the time being, the program of Eucharistic Exposition in the parish looks like this:

Eucharistic Exposition is available ½ hour before weekday Mass during the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter (which is slightly under half a year).

The four Sunday Holy Hours will be restored at their usual times and dates (3pm on Laetare Sunday, Good Shepherd Sunday, Corpus Christi, and in October). The only thing I am currently uncertain about is when Confirmations will take place at St Joseph's. In consequence, the October Holy Hour will most likely take place on the 1st October (during school holidays).

The Holy Hour which was formerly held following the Saturday morning Mass has been cancelled for two reasons. Firstly, because there is already a time of Exposition held on Saturday (half an hour before 9am Mass), and secondly, because the 9am Sunday choir has moved its rehearsal time to 10:30am Saturday morning. Not having Exposition during this time enables the choir to set up and to rehearse freely.

Confessions will still be held during this time, and the background sounds the choir makes will ensure that the confessions are not overheard by the penitents waiting in line!

I have been asked a few times if we can have a section of the Church reserved for penitents waiting in line, with a series of arrows facilitating the progression of the queue (like they have at St Francis in the city). However, as the front pews of the Church are frequently being reserved for other purposes (such as mobility-challenged parishioners or for the candidates preparing to be formally received into the Catholic faith), then this is not a viable option at this time.

Finally, the Legion of Mary hosts a time of Eucharistic Exposition in the St Mary of the Cross MacKillop chapel in the parish centre most Wednesday evenings between 6 to 7pm. Entrance via the school office gate on Argyle Avenue.


