Palm Sunday Passion of the Lord 2 April 2023

A RARE DISEASE JOURNEY—NIAMH AND MAREE DALTON—Part 6

Weeks of Lent Themes – Week 6 – Gethsemane, suffering, pain

Returning from the USA, armed with so much information, I proceeded to advocate for Niamh. I wrote to and called politicians, as well as media outlets, in the hope of spreading information about GM1 and rare diseases. It was an uphill battle but I persisted!

Niamh and Seb celebrated their First Holy Communion on the 11th of August 2018, another wonderful day with Father Brendan Hogan conducting the celebration.

COVID brought about big changes in everyone's life, with no work and no school but I really enjoyed the time that I had with Niamh whilst we were locked away at home. Remote learnind was not my forte, but I gave it my best shot, and made Niamh laugh while doing so!!

During one of the lockdowns, Niamh was admitted to the Royal Children's Hospital for back surgery (August 2020), after being on the wait list for over 2 years. Niamh has scoliosis and her spine was not in good shape. Her Orthopaedic surgeon was confident that Niamh would be ready to go home post op in 4 to 6 days. This was not to be. Whilst in Post Op recovery, Niamh was given a bag of glucose, despite her wearing a bright red hospital tag indicating no sugar/carbohydrates or glucose ever. Her receiving this caused Niamh to have many sei-

zures. While I was by her bed, she stopped breathing and the terror I felt was palpable.

Alarms sounding and nurses panicking. Our hospital stay ended up being 8

weeks – with the first 3 spent trying to stabilise Niamh after the glucose had been given. This then put her behind in rehabilitation, hence the long stay. Niamh was in a great deal of pain, and it was so hard seeing her like that. A very difficult time, with me holding a great deal of anger towards the medical staff who had made a



huge mistake in giving her that fluid. My support network of my sisters and their families were unable to come to the hospital due to the lockdowns too, which didn't help! I drew on support from Helen, in Chaplaincy support, prayed in the Hospital Chapel and ioined in shouted conversations across hallways with other mums!

In February 2021, a break through in my advocating endeavours, with Niamh & I invited onto the Today Show on Channel 9 for Rare Disease Day - February 28th. It was fantastic to be able to share Niamh's story and to raise awareness of, not only GM1, but all rare diseases.

Niamh and Seb received the Sacrament of Confirmation on the 20th of March 2021, after many reschedules due to COVID. I was touched when Seb asked me to be his Sponsor, happily fulfilling this for a child who was been more than a cousin to Niamh. My nephew (and Godson) Josh was Niamh's sponsor. Father Hogan presided again – a touching celebration at Our Lady Help of Christian's.

In August 2021, we moved from Narre Warren to Springvale (the 5 of us), starting a new chapter in our lives. Niamh moved from the amazing Nepean School to the equally amazing Glenallen School in Glen Waverly due to the house move/ school zonina.

On returning to work at Crown Casino after the lockdowns, I began to guestion my working there. I have always been career driven, but the changes in me after Niamh's diagnosis, the time with her during COVID & a certain Royal Commission made me want to change, to be a better mum & person Continued in middle pages.... and to help others.
