PARISH OF ST JOSEPH CHELSEA

Second Sunday of Easter 16 April 2023



This week we have the Second Sunday of Easter (15th April 2023). The Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Divine Mercy is about learning more about the mercy of God, learning to trust in Jesus, and living our lives as being merciful to others, as Christ is merciful to all of us.

God loves us, and He wants us to recognise that His mercy is greater than our sins, We can call upon God with trust and share His joy with others.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is a powerful prayer, in which rosary beads are used. We pray for mercy in our own lives, and to remind ourselves that we must rely on God, replacing our weaknesses and anxieties with trust in Him.

This Sunday during the Divine Mercy Holy Hour (which begins in St Joseph's Church from 2:30pm), the Chaplet will focus on contemplating the wounds of Christ. Jesus told St Faustina "When it seems to you that your suffering exceeds your strength, contemplate My wounds" (Diary, 1184, 1512). Such reflection upon what Jesus endured to save us from our sins may strengthen our faith, and put what happens in our lives into perspective.

As St Faustina wrote in her diary "The first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy ... which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbours always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to excuse or absolve yourself from it" (Diary of St. Faustina, 742).

Divine Mercy Sunday will be observed at St Joseph's Parish in the following ways:

- Half an hour before each Sunday Mass (including Saturday Vigil) confessions will be available and the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed (sung before the 11am Mass)
- 2:30 pm Sunday 16th April Chaplet of Divine Mercy prayed in St Joseph's Church followed by the Stations of the Cross
