girl got up at once and began to walk
about, for she was twelve years old. At
this they were overcome with
astonishment, and he ordered them
strictly not to let anyone know about it,
and told them to give her something to

PARISH NEWS:

MESSAGE FROM FR. JAMES PUPPADY.

"I will give thanks to you Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of your wonderful deeds" Ps: 9:1

My dear brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ.

First of all, I thank you for your warm welcome to the parish.

A short note about me. I am appointed as your Parish Priest from 9th June 2021 for six years. I was born on 2nd August 1964 at Thrissur district in Kerala State, India. 52 AD St. Thomas the Apostle came to this state and converted the people into Christianity. So it is a strong catholic faith community in this state. I was the first child of my parents Varghese and Josephine. I had 4 siblings and the second one died at the age of two. Now we are four children and I have three nieces and 3 nephews. I lost my father on 24th August 2014. I did my schooling in the Carmelite fathers' school. The whole family is very strong in their faith. My childhood was very much attached to the church. So the childhood itself I had a desire to become a priest. After secondary, I joined the seminary.

I did my seminary studies in different places and I was ordained on 18th April 1993. I was ordained for a mission in India. I worked there 19 years as a parish priest and schools in different parishes. The place I worked is Vijayawada diocese, Andhra Pradesh. Different language, different culture and everything was different from my own native state. The mission life was really hard and I could do the best I can in the mission.

Then on 8th May, I arrived in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. Archbishop Denis Hart DD, Gave me a warm welcome to the Archdiocese. Fr. Greg Burke and Mgr. Greg Bennett helped me to know the place and the people around. Then on 14th of June I was asked to be at St. Thomas Parish, Drysdale for one and half months to learn about the parish. On 1st of August 2012, I was appointed as an administrator of the parish. Fr. Des Panton who was the parish priest retired on 1st of August. After one year on 1st of November 2013 I was appointed as a parish priest at St. Thomas, Drysdale with 4 churches and two schools and 5 nursing homes. My parents were present on the occasion of my installation as a parish priest. So I was there for 9 years and served the people the best I could.

Now Archbishop Peter Comensoli DD, asked me to be the parish priest of St. Oliver Plunkett, Pascoe Vale and St. Paul's, Coburg. He appointed me on 9th of June 2021. In the future it is going to be a mission too. Now I am here to serve you. Let us journey together to establish God's kingdom. Kindly pray for me. You are all in my prayers too. God bless us all.

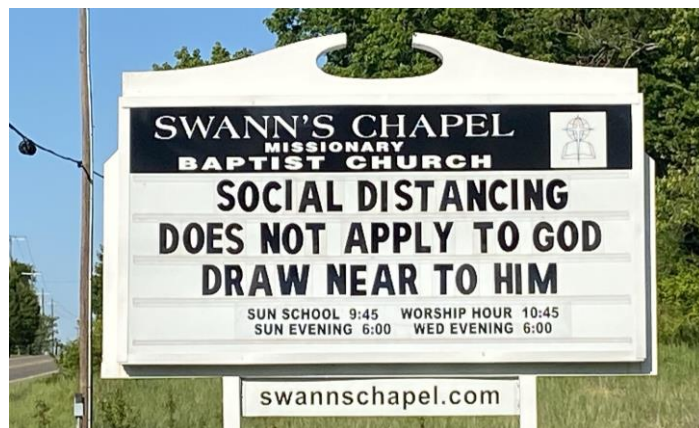
