I need to restrain that tendency, while not letting myself become a doormat for the agendas of everyone else. But I am further encouraged by today's second reading, where St. Paul has matured spiritually—to the point where he finds joy in the hardship and suffering he may have to endure in order to serve his community better for the love of Christ. That may be a long process for us, but it is truly worth the effort.
