A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by the

angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. 'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop any crossing from your side to ours." 'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."'

In today's Gospel we see that with our own generosity we must bridge that gap between those who have much and those who have little or we may find ourselves on the wrong side of the chasm in the next life.

REFLECTION: “Sounding the Alarm”

If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead. Luke 16:31

The lesson in the parable of the rich man and Lazarus seems so obvious—to us. We know Jesus rose from the dead in fulfillment of the prophecies. We won't end up like the rich man, suffering in the afterworld for his self-absorbed, indulgent lifestyle, right?! Isn't it sad that some people don't believe in the resurrection?

Well, yes, it is sad. Very sad. But perhaps it's even more sad when we don't recognize that our own resurrection requires more than believing in his. If we spend our lives focused on satisfying our own physical wants and desires, there's little room for our neighbors or the Lord. May we learn from the rich man and understand that getting caught up in our earthly trappings is a trap. May we be persuaded by his example to conduct ourselves as if our lives depend on the Lord—because they do.

Jesus, help me to leave behind my selfish obsessions and follow you.

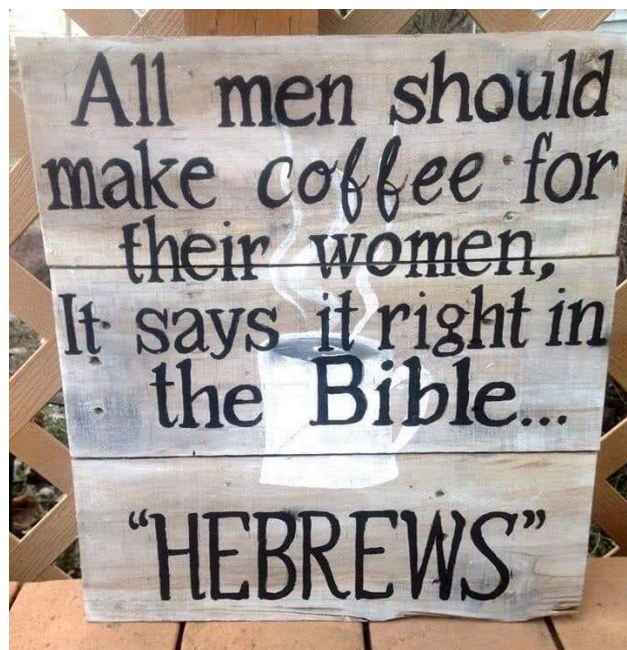
