## Lent and the Holy Mass

On the first Sunday of Lent, we hear of the Lord's retreat into the wilderness for forty days. The wilderness is a place of deprivation. The Lord is deprived of all natural supports except the one thing that matters most: His Father. The wilderness, then, is about getting back to basics. Everything non-essential is left aside so that attention can be given to that which matters most. During the forty days of Lent, we imitate Our Lord. We get back to basics. We give our attention to God alone, voluntarily renouncing certain lesser goods that we sometimes allow to come between us and God.

During Lent, the Church's liturgy reflects this spirit of simple attention to the essentials. We omit the 'Glory to God' and the 'Alleluia'. We refrain from using flowers. From the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the crucifixes, statues and images will be covered with purple cloth. In this way, the sacred liturgy reminds us that the supreme focus of our lives and the Mass is God.

In this spirit, there will be a couple of adjustments to Sunday Masses from this weekend. The introduction before Mass will be omitted, as will be the parish prayer from the Prayers of the Faithful. The beginning of Mass will henceforth be indicated by the ringing of a bell. The introduction and parish prayer have served good purposes, but they are also impositions upon the rites of the Mass. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, which contains the rubrics (rules) for the celebration of Mass, cautions us against such impositions: "[T]he priest will remember that he is the servant of the Sacred Liturgy and that he is not permitted, on his own initiative, to add, to remove, or to change anything in the celebration of Mass." The structure of the Mass, as it is given to us by the Church, serves a very specific purpose: to unite us with the Son in offering loving worship to the Father.

During the week, we received delivery of new altar cloths for both churches. The cloths have been blessed and now adorn our altars. These cloths are made from white Irish linen and were sewn by the nuns of the Carmelite Convent in Launceston, Tasmania. These remarkable women devote their lives to the service of God and the Church in the obscurity of enclosed monasticism. They have assured me of their prayers for Corio Lara Parish. The use of cloths to cover the altar during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is very ancient. We have testimony from the AD300s that all Christians knew altar cloths were a necessity, suggesting that the cloths were in universal use from the second or even first century. Like everything used in the Mass, altar cloths have a practical use but are also highly symbolic. The altar, on which the unbloody Sacrifice is offered, signifies the Body of Christ, through which the blood Sacrifice was offered. The altar cloths, therefore, signify the white burial cloths of Christ. They also remind us of our white baptismal garment, which itself signifies the gift of sanctifying grace, merited by the sacrifice of Christ.
