

Fourth Sunday of Lent (Year B) | 'Gaudete' Sunday

Persevering through Lent

Lent often begins with a holy excitement, a genuine desire to shed our comforts and attachments and draw closer to Christ. Our foreheads display sombre ash crosses that reflect the quiet resoluteness in our souls.

As the weeks progress, the walk to Calvary often becomes a slow trudge as we inevitably confront our wretchedness. Unexpected circumstances shake our resolve. We joyfully surrendered social media, sweets and coffee, yet now our flesh pines for relief. We are tested in charity by unwanted visitors, difficult people and stressful situations. We fall back into grumbling and gossiping. The early consolations disappear, and prayer is dry and difficult. The silent time we planned with God is disrupted by the incessant chatter of our thoughts. We asked God for spiritual maturity, and much to our dismay, He granted our request. Indeed, we wanted holiness, but only on our terms.

Our failures can sometimes lead to frustration with ourselves. Some will grow discouraged and give up. Some cling to self-will and grit their way through miserably. The saints, however, tell us that victory over sin comes from meekly offering our nothingness to Jesus and fully relying on His transformative grace to heal us.

Father Jacques Phillippe states that "The repeated experience of one's own poverty and misery can sometimes drive a person to abandon the ambition of becoming holy. The remedy is humility, recognition of one's powerlessness, together with *audacious hope and blind faith* in the power and mercy of God".

Each of us will eventually come to know our true condition. We are fickle and proud; woefully inept at loving God and neighbour. This should not surprise us or cause despair. In the wilderness of self-knowledge, Christ meets us, ministering to our hearts and binding up our wounds. Redemption is the balm He offers to those who those who sincerely seek Him.

Let us expect a struggle and we will be better prepared when it comes. One desert monk taught that "It is by warfare that the soul makes progress", and it is here saints are made. We can take comfort in the chaos of our lives, our interior turbulence, our natural inclination to rebel. Does not the enemy roar when we take steps towards God? The lifelong journey of sanctification can be sweaty and unglamourous. Habitual sins need repeated washing in the Blood of Christ. Our minds are renewed and reoriented by constant immersion in prayer, Scripture and the Sacraments.

We fight so that we may win Heaven, but we fight not in our own strength. In the end, we are naked and poor, and have nothing but the free will that God gave us. Our weapon, in this season of trial, is simply our Yes- we can repeatedly choose Christ even if we fall, fumble, and don't feel like it. It is our perseverance and humility in the great battle that will ultimately win us His eternal friendship.
