

Entrance Antiphon

Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia.

Communion Antiphon

The Christ had to suffer and on the third day rise from the dead; in his name repentance and remission of sins must be preached to all the nations, alleluia.

THE EASTER SEASON CONTINUES

As a liturgical season, Easter lasts fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection through to Pentecost. We might say it has two fundamental elements: living with the Risen Lord and praying for the coming of the Holy Spirit. We're nearly halfway through the Season, but as Christians, those two elements can and should be a part of our everyday lives. Let's invite the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on us and lead us to new and deeper encounters with Jesus.

A JOYFUL NOISE

As we continue the slow march to 'normal' with our masses and liturgies, one of the lovely things to see is the return of younger families and new families too. Naturally, from time to time, some of the children become a bit restless and upset throughout mass. If you find yourself in this situation, I know it can be unsettling and embarrassing, but please know: **you and your little ones are welcome and you are wanted!** It is good that you are here and it's an encouragement to others. It can also be an opportunity to teach our little ones about prayer and what is going on at mass, so please don't feel you have to step outside as soon as your little one becomes a little rowdy. CHURCH CAPACITIES

Last week the National Cabinet announced that seated venues can move to a '1 square metre rule' and there are reports the MCG will be allowed 100% capacity for ANZAC day. Frustratingly **churches have again not been included in these changes** and we remain with the 2sq.M rule. The Archbishop has contacted both Federal and State Governments urging for equal treatment for Faith Communities. Until we hear anything further our capacities remain unchanged with Corio: 120 & Lara:150.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

(3: 13-15, 17-19)

Peter said to the people: "You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate, after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses. "Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM *Ps 4* Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord

SECOND READING A reading from the first letter of St John

(2: 1-5)

I am writing this, my children, to stop you sinning; but if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's. We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments. Anyone who says, "I know him", and does not keep his commandments, is a liar, refusing to admit the truth. But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, explain the scriptures to us. Make our hearts burn within us as you talk to us. Alleluia!

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke

(24:35-48)

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread. They were still talking about this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you!" In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, "Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes. Then he told them, "This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled." He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this."
