

Lockdown announced

With the current lockdown, **all masses, baptisms, holy hours and prayer groups must be cancelled until the restrictions are eased**. If the lockdown ends as scheduled at 11.59PM on Tuesday evening, the Wednesday morning mass at Lara will go ahead and our regular mass time table will continue. As with previous lockdowns, it is unlikely that our permitted numbers in church will spring back to what they were, so we'll have a better picture on Wednesday regarding masses next Sunday.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus tells his disciples to come away to a lonely place. It was an invitation to retreat, recuperate and then return to the hustle and bustle. With Victoria returning to lockdown – and everything happening so quickly – many may find themselves in a lonely place, with isolation and disconnection having been some of the sad consequences of the various health measures. While it is certainly a difficult time, perhaps we can also use it for some rest and recollection. As Jesus saw the crowds and took pity on them, so he sees us and loves us. In the 'holy darkness' of our struggles, the Lord, our Good Shepherd, meets us and walks with us. Let's listen for his voice and follow him.

We also share his love with each other, reaching out to those around us, perhaps making those phone calls or checking in on a sick or elderly neighbour. As we keep each other in prayer, let's be especially mindful of parishioners who live alone and those significantly affected, such as the students who were beginning to prepare for First Holy Communion and the Sharmoa and Pleseh families who were finally supposed to be baptised at the 11am mass this weekend. This was possibly the fifth rescheduling of their baptisms due to the various restrictions and sadly we must do so again. Though we don't know exactly where the Lord is leading us in times like these, we can have great confidence knowing that following our Good Shepherd, there is nothing we shall want.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

"Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks! "See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The Lord-our-integrity."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM *Ps* 22 The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

SECOND READING A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians (2: 13-18)

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far apart from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice says the Lord, I know them and they follow me. Alleluia!

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark (6: 30- 34)

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, "You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while"; for there were so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But people saw them going, and many could guess where; and from every town they all hurried to the place on foot and reached it before them. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at some length.
