

## Latest easing of restrictions

With the latest easing of restrictions that begin this weekend, religious gatherings may now be held using the 1 per 4 square metre rule.

Some headlines have mentioned that there is a cap of 300 people but this is only for churches/spaces that can fit that many under the rule. For us, the limits are sadly much less: **80 people at Corio & 100 at Lara.** This means that booking your attendance at our weekend masses is still essential at this stage. Please continue to book by contacting Arlean at the Parish Office from Monday – Friday, 9am – 3pm.

Last weekend there were over a dozen people who booked places but didn't turn up. While things do come up, if you have booked and can no longer attend, please let us know so that we can offer the place to someone else.

Thank you again to everyone for your patience with all of the requirements. Let's pray that they don't go on for too long.

- The churches will be locked once mass begins so please be on time

# LITURGY OF THE WORD

#### FIRST READING A reading from the book of Job

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said: Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, then I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break.

#### **SECOND READING** A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Corinthians

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them. From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ the sower; whoever finds the seed will remain for ever. Alleluia!

#### **GOSPEL** A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark (4: 35- 41)

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us cross over to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, "Master, do you not care? We are going down!" And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Quiet now! Be calm!" And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, "Why are you frightened? How is it that you have no faith?" They were filled with awe and said to one another, "Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him."
