

<u>Entrance Antiphon</u>

How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honour. To him belong glory and power for ever and ever **Communion Antiphon**

The Lord sits as King for ever. The Lord will bless his people with peace.

With the Feast of Christ the King this Sunday, we enter the last week of the Church Calendar which begins again next week, with the First Sunday of Advent. We proclaim him King of the Universe, King of our families and King of our hearts and lives. This Sunday is also celebrated in the Church as World Youth Day. We pray for all young people that they will know the King and take their rightful places in the Kingdom.

This weekend we also welcome the latest easing of restrictions as Victoria passes the 90% vaccination threshold. The finer details have yet to be released but for us the immediate changes regard numbers we can have at mass: No density limit if everyone is double vaccinated and a cap of fifty people if we don't check for vaccination status.

This means **from next week, you no longer need to book your attendance at any of our Parish Masses**. We will continue our current schedule of weekend masses including the 5.30pm Vigil (non-disclosed vaccination status). This mass along with our weekday masses will be capped at 50 people and will be attendance on a first come-first served basis.

Proof of double vaccination is required at the indicated masses. We have received clarification that this requirement now applies to everyone aged 12 years and above.

Masks are no longer required but continue to be recommended given the number of people in the church at one time. Checking in continues to be requirement every time we enter the church.

Weekend masses: Sat 7pm, Sunday 9am & 11am: Double Vaccination required

Sat 5.30pm Vigil (and weekdays): Non-disclosure of vax status

A reminder that there are no weekday masses or Holy Hour this week. They will all resume next week.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from the prophet Daniel

(7: 13-14)

I gazed into the visions of the night. And I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence.
