

The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia. Communion Antiphon

On the last day of the festival, Jesus stood and cried out: If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink, Alleluia.

Our fifty day Easter celebrations conclude this weekend with Pentecost: the great Feast of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes called the birthday of the Church, we'll commemorate this glorious mystery of our faith: the arrival of the Holy Spirit, God who is with us until the end of time. After this weekend, the Paschal Candle which has been lit at every mass since Easter Sunday – as a symbol of the risen Christ – is now moved to the baptismal font. Instead of that candle being lit, we ourselves are called and sent to be symbols of the risen Christ in the world, sharing his light and warmth with those around us.

The Great Feasts of Our Lord as we return to Ordinary Time

While we return to Ordinary Time from Monday, we aren't quite done with festivities. Over the next two Sundays we will celebrate the Most Holy Trinity followed by *Corpus Christi*, and the Friday after that is the Feast of the Sacred Heart. At some of the masses for these feasts, we will be welcoming new members into the Church. These candidates had their RCIA journeys upended because of the various lockdowns and covid restrictions, but we rejoice with them as they now complete their initiation.

<u>Covid Latest</u>

Our QR codes at the entrances to our churches and gathering spaces have now been switched over to the government's required system. We now request that all attendees register their attendance by using the QR codes. Please do not let this requirement trouble your attendance at mass. There will be people to help if you don't have a phone or struggle to use it.

In happier news, from next weekend, venues less than 400 square metres (ie. both our churches) can increase to 200 people. This means that we should comfortably accommodate everyone and we no longer need the overflow seating that we've used at some of our 11am masses.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

(2:1-11)

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. "Surely" they said "all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM *Ps 103* Lord, send out your spirit and renew the face of the earth.

SECOND READING A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians (5: 16-25)

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desires. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

Alleluia, alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Alleluia!

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John

(15: 26-27; 16: 12-15)

Jesus said to his disciples:

'When the Advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness. And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset. 'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: *All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.*'
