From this weekend, we welcome the news that religious gatherings in regional Victoria may now be held using the 1 per 2 square metre rule. This brings us back to our limits from before the last lockdown: **150 people at Corio & 190 at Lara.** This change however can only be utilised if we have 'Covid Marshalls' in place who ensure that people check in properly.

This means that we're putting the call out for volunteers who will act as our covid marshalls at each mass. While our sacristans and welcomers have been doing this over the last few weeks, if anyone else is willing to help out, please let us know.

Thankfully, with the increased numbers we **no longer need to book** ahead for our attendance at masses. It's important to note though that if we don't have Covid Marshalls in place, then we will have to revert to the 1:4 square metre rule. While we're not expecting a huge rush to fill all the available spots, those who have booked places at mass this weekend will have priority access.

A sincere and very big thank you to everyone who have booked there places and have followed all the requirements.

A note on Sunday Masses

- Bookings no longer required for masses.
- 1:2 SqM rule in place
- Masks must be worn
- QR check-in required (there will be someone to help with this)
 - Attendees must show a covid marshall the 'Green Tick' that they've checked in.
- The **churches will be locked once mass begins** so please be on time

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from the book of Wisdom

(1: 13-15; 2: 23-24)

Death was not God's doing, he takes no pleasure in the extinction of the living. To be – for this he created all; the world's created things have health in them, in them no fatal poison can be found, and Hades holds no power on earth; for virtue is undying. Yet God did make man imperishable, he made him in the image of his own nature; it was the devil's envy that brought death into the world, as those who are his partners will discover.

SECOND READING A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Corinthians (8: 7, 9, 13-15)

You always have the most of everything – of faith, of eloquence, of understanding, of keenness for any cause, and the biggest share of our affection – so we expect you to put the most into this work of mercy too. Remember how generous the Lord Jesus was; he was rich, but he became poor for your sake, to make you rich out of his poverty. This does not mean that to give relief to others you ought to make things difficult for yourselves: it is a question of balancing what happens to be your surplus now against their present need, and one day they may have something to spare that will supply your own need. That is how we strike a balance: as scripture says: The man who gathered much had none too much, the man who gathered little did not go short.

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark (5: 21-43)

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, "My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life." Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him. While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, "Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?" But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, "Do not be afraid; only have faith." And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, "Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep." But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, "Talitha, kum!" which means, "Little girl, I tell you to get up." The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.
