# Sunday 28th November 2021 FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

#### Entrance Antiphon

To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame.

## Communion Antiphon

The Lord will bestow his bounty, and our earth shall yield its increase.

This Sunday we begin a new liturgical year. While our news feeds and mailboxes are flooded with Black Friday to Mad Monday sales advertisements sparking the pre-Christmas sales rushes, we are invited to truly prepare for Christmas by returning again, with these few weeks of preparation. Just as we make New Year Resolutions from January, perhaps we can use this weekend to make resolutions in our spiritual life to prepare both for Christmas and 2022. This weekend, we will light the first of the Advent Candles, which is traditionally called the candle of hope. Hope is certainly a virtue we can ask the Lord to give all of us after these difficult months. For those who are making a wreath at home, here is a prayer of blessing that you can use:

#### Scripture Reading (Isaiah 9:1-2):

But there will be no gloom for those who were in anguish. In the former time he brought into contempt the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the latter time he will make glorious the way of the sea, the land beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined.

#### *Prayer of blessing:*

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ:

he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Saviour of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

# *Prayer for lighting the first candle:*

All-powerful God, increase our strength of will for doing good that Christ may find an eager welcome at his coming and call us to his side in the kingdom of heaven, where he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit one God, forever and ever. Amen.

And may he so confirm your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless in the sight of our God and Father when our Lord Jesus Christ comes with all his saints. Finally, brothers, we urge you and appeal to you in the Lord Jesus to make more and more progress in the kind of life that you are meant to live: the life that God wants, as you learnt from us, and as you are already living it. You have not forgotten the instructions we gave you on the authority of the Lord Jesus.

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke

(21:25-28, 34-36)

Jesus said to his disciples: "There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars; on earth nations in agony, bewildered by the clamour of the ocean and its waves; men dying of fear as they await what menaces the world, for the powers of heaven will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand. "Watch yourselves, or your hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life, and that day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap. For it will come down on every living man on the face of the earth. Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man."

### The Nicene Creed
