

You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

Like the deer that yearns for running streams, so my soul is yearning for you, my God; my soul is thirsting for God, the living God.

"Speak Lord, your servant is listening..." That Alleluia verse for this Sunday is a beautiful line that we might use to begin our periods of prayer each day. It's only a few words but has many layers. It reminds us that prayer is a dialogue: a conversation between friends. It's not a performance or saying the right thing but about sharing our heart with the One who made them and holds them in his own. As with any conversation, we can't be the only ones doing the talking(!). I find it easy asking the Lord to speak when I'm struggling with something. It's what comes next that is the hard part: listening. For some mystics they might hear a voice but for the most of us, it's learning to be still, to be attentive, recognising when we've been distracted and bringing ourselves back to our Friend's presence. We might ask that the Lord touch our hearts and offer the same word for us that he used in the gospel: *Ephphata:* Be opened. Open to his life and love.

September is sometimes called the Month of the Holy Cross (The Feast of the Holy Cross is 14th September). As we begin this new month, continuing our lockdown we know the reality of the cross. Each of us faces our own cross which we are invited to carry. The Cross is painful and frightening and lonely, but let's never forget that Jesus is there too: God with us. And there on the Cross, he opened his heart for all of us. Following him, let's open our hearts to God and to one another. Listneing to him, because as the Alleluia verse continues: He has the words of eternal life.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from Prophet Isaiah

(35: 4-7)

Say to all faint hearts, "Courage! Do not be afraid. "Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy; for water gushes in the desert, streams in the wasteland, the scorched earth becomes a lake, the parched land springs of water.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM *Ps* 145 My Soul, give praise to the Lord.

SECOND READING A reading from the letter of St James (2: 1-5)

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, "Come this way to the best seats;" then you tell the poor man, "Stand over there" or "You can sit on the floor by my footrest." Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that? Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Alleluia, alleluia! Speak, Lord, your servant is listening: you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark (7: 31 - 37)

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. "He has done all things well," they said "he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak."
