#### Message from Fr Daryl

#### Our first steps back to Mass

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As you will know, on Wednesday this past week (the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima!), some of the Covid-19 restrictions were relaxed. This means that churches may reopen under certain strict conditions, which will be in place for at least, the next three weeks. They include:

- A limit of 10 people in attendance, with strict monitoring of numbers
- All present must leave contact details (for possible contact tracing)
- 1.5m social distancing & sanitiser/hygiene practices
- Full clean and sanitising of the church after each opening time

The question that immediately arises is 'when can we start returning to mass?!' Some parishioners have already contacted the Parish asking, and some have offered suggestions on ways that we can begin to move forward. With you, I am excited at the possibility and look forward to meeting you and most importantly joining together in the public celebration of the Faith.

#### Weekday Masses

Starting Tuesday, the opportunity to attend weekday morning mass will be available. St Francis Xavier, Corio on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. St Anthony of Padua, Lara on Wednesday and Friday. **Mass will be at 8:30AM**. This allows us to move into the church prior to the school children drop off time.

#### **Weekday Adoration**

A further opportunity for prayer over these three weeks will be Eucharistic Adoration between **5:30 – 6PM**: St Francis Xavier, Corio on Tuesday and Thursday. St Anthony of Padua, Lara on Wednesday and Friday. Confessions will be available at this time also.

#### Registering attendance

To register your attendance for either mass or adoration, please **ring the Parish Office between 10AM and 3PM the day before** you wish to attend. Registration will close once the limit of 10 people has been reached. If for some reason, we can't answer the phone, leave your details on the voicemail. The timestamp will show us your place in line. Sadly, only those on the list for a specific day will be allowed in the church at that time.

While we will observe all the guidelines and protocols, the risk of contracting coronavirus still remains. **If you are vulnerable, immuno-compromised or feeling unwell, please stay at home.** 

**Sunday Masses** Our Parish is blessed with an average attendance in excess of 650 people across the Sunday masses each weekend. This fact, along with the strict conditions above, means that we can't yet return to Sunday Mass at this stage. I acknowledge that this will be both disappointing and frustrating, which I very much share with you. We're reminded that the exemption from the Sunday obligation continues and I encourage you to continue to find ways to 'keep the Lord's day holy.'

The above conditions are in place until 31<sup>st</sup> May. When the next steps are outlined, we will look again at how we can continue to move forward.

Thank you for your patience. Let's continue to support each other in prayer every day during these trying times. God bless!


