

While we might have been expecting it, it's with real sadness that we must once again suspend all public masses, liturgies and gatherings in our Parish. As regional Victoria reintroduces level three lockdowns for at least the next six weeks, the new normal that we had been working out with registering and adjustments within mass must also pause. This will be in effect until Saturday 13th September.

Although our churches have closed, our Parish is still open. The Parish Team will work from home, meaning that much of the regular day to day activities will be greatly reduced, but we will still be responding to emails and taking calls. Please do not hesitate to contact the Parish if we might be of any assistance.

From Monday, there will be a little 'supply station' on the front porch of the Parish House where you can pick up copies of the latest bulletin, little bottles of holy water, rosaries, prayer cards, etc. It will be there from 9am – 6pm each day. Unfortunately it can't be left out 24hrs, since, as you may know, there was an attempted break-in to the presbytery, in the night earlier this week (they didn't get in and nothing was stolen, but still pretty scary!).

Let me repeat something I mentioned at the last public mass we had this week: something I've observed over these last few months (with those I've been blessed to meet so far) is that our Parishioners really do care for each other. They know each other; love each other; and also like each other! So let's continue to care for one another, holding each other in prayer and reaching out with a call or saying hello if we run into each other at the shops. Please know that you are all in my poor prayers and if you have any intention that you wish me to bring the Altar, do let me know.

SECOND READING A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Romans 9: 1-5

What I want to say now is no pretence; I say it in union with Christ – it is the truth – my conscience in union with the Holy Spirit assures me of it too. What I want to say is this: my sorrow is so great, my mental anguish so endless, I would willingly be condemned and be cut off from Christ if it could help my brothers of Israel, my own flesh and blood. GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 14: 22-33

'Jesus walks on the water'

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. 
