

On Saturday this weekend (15th August) we celebrate in our lockdowns the Assumption of Our Lady into heaven: that when her earthly life ended, she was taken soul and body into heaven. It's our destiny too. The invitation for us is to say yes to God as Mary did.

Honouring Our Lady as we do, seems quite a contrast to the conversation that Our Lord is having with the Canaanite woman in this Sunday's gospel. On the surface it's a pretty difficult gospel to preach on, and even harder for a bulletin front page! What we can remember though is that Jesus is God: he loves her with infinite love and knows what he's doing. He's moving into gentile territory; he knew he would encounter non-Jewish people. While it looks like she is making the initiative, Jesus was already making his way toward her. The exchange wasn't to put her down – we see she could hold her own! – but to draw out the great faith that she already had.

These difficult times that we're all experiencing might be an opportunity to again draw out our faith. Perhaps we might take a look at our friendship with God, to see how and where we might spend more time with him; to waste time with him just as we do with our closest friends. Just as we want to follow Mary to be with God in heaven, let's follow her example now and say yes to God.

Let's continue to keep each other in prayer. God bless you very much!

SECOND READING A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans 11: 13- 15, 29-32

'With Israel, God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice'

Let me tell you pagans this: I have been sent to the pagans as their apostle, and I am proud of being sent, but the purpose of it is to make my own people envious of you, and in this way save some of them. Since their rejection meant the reconciliation of the world, do you know what their admission will mean? Nothing less than a resurrection from the dead! God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice. Just as you changed from being disobedient to God, and now enjoy mercy because of their disobedience, so those who are disobedient now – and only because of the mercy shown to you – will also enjoy mercy eventually. God has imprisoned all men in their own disobedience only to show mercy to all mankind. *The Word of the Lord*

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 14: 22-33

'The Canaanite woman debates with Jesus and saves her daughter'

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' 
