

The little lockdown reminded us that we are still far from the 'old normal' that we might long for. Being unable to celebrate Ash Wednesday together was both sad and frustrating, and we pray that it isn't an indication of a possible repeat to Lent and Easter 2020. As a Parish, we've come out of the last year together strongly and we've adapted to face whatever has come our way and I'm sure we'll continue to do so. One adaption is that we'll have the blessing and distribution of ashes at our masses this weekend.

Lent is a time of preparation and renewal. It's an invitation to commit or recommit to our friendship with the Lord. It's called a time of conversion, and the traditional practices or prayer, fasting and almsgiving are put before us to help us 'repent and believe in the Gospel.'

One powerful way that we can turn back to God is through Sacramental Confession. In it, we can hear the words of God's loving mercy and reconciliation. Let's not be afraid to receive such a great gift, even if it's been a long time. During Lent, Reconciliation will be available on Tuesday evenings during the regular Holy Hour and I'll also endeavour to be available for 20 minutes before every mass at either church.

The Stations of the Cross will be held each Friday, 6:30pm at Corio. It will be lead by the Legion of Mary. Confessions will be also be available for an hour beforehand each week.

A Parish Penitential Service with opportunities for Reconciliation with visiting priests will also be held on Thursday 18th March at 7PM. More details to come but save the date.

While all the best made plans may have to be dropped with little notice during these unpredictable times, there is nothing more sure in the universe than God's love... for us, for you. Let's keep each other in prayer throughout this holy season, as we respond to his great love. God bless!

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from book of Genesis

(9:8-15)

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: nothing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

SECOND READING A reading from the First Letter of St Peter

(3:18-22)

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
