

The latest steps in the *Roadmap* still do not allow us to gather inside for mass. The Premier has voiced that this may make further announcements this Sunday (25th) but at the time of writing this is still case.

Currently mass is permitted outdoors for up to twenty people. From next week, we will trial mass at the front doors of our churches. This presents some logistical challenges and so we'll begin slowly with only weekend masses:

Saturday Vigil: **5:30PM Corio** – We'll revert to the usual 7PM once we're back inside Sunday 9: 00AM at Lara & Sunday 11:00AM at Corio.

The twenty person limit includes any readers/ministers/etc, and each mass will continue regardless of the weather so please remember that it might be cold and wet(!), and to bear this in mind when booking.

Bookings:

A dedicated number has been established to take bookings. The phone and booking diary will be carried by volunteers and will be answered from **Tuesday to Friday: 12 Noon – 5PM.** If you're unable to call during these times, please call or email the Parish Office and we can work something out, however a place is only assured once your name is recorded in the booking diary. The phone number for bookings is **0435 699 399.** (Nb. As this phone will be transferred between volunteers after 5pm each night, voicemails will not be checked regularly and do not guarantee a place at mass). I acknowledge that this process is rather involved. This is because there is no one at the parish office for most of the week.

Parish Office news

Given the easing of restrictions in Regional Victoria, I've been in contact with the Archdiocese asking that we can resume Parish Office duties. They have requested a gradual return but have allowed us to reopen one day a week. I'm very happy to announce that Arlean, our Parish Secretary will return to working at the office each Friday, from this week (30th)

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING A reading from Book of Exodus 20: 22-26

'If you are harsh with the widow and orphan, my anger will flare against you'

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this: "'You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "'If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him. "'If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."'

SECOND READING A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians 1: 5-10 'You broke with idolatry and became servants of God; you are now waiting for his Son'

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread – and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming. *The Word of the Lord*

GOSPEL A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 22: 34-40 'The Commandments of love'

Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. We pray for all those who work and live from the sea, among them sailors, fishermen and their families.


