Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Mt 13:24-43

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn.""

He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.'

He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.' In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfill the prophecy:

I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us.' He said in reply. 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!'



What is a ReachOut Ministry ?

The vision of this Ministry is to have parishioners of St Justin's involved in a ReachOut community, meet monthly to share life and faith in a small group setting and thereby growing in Spiritual love.

Reflections - Catholics reminded to preach the Gospel always, everywhere.

Catholics are being urged to 'preach all the Gospel, to all the world, all the time' and to consider encounter, discipleship and mission from their Catholic foundations in a new document from the Bishops Commission for Evangelisation, Laity and Ministry.



The document, titled *Evangelisation*, offers a scriptural and theological reflection on the proclamation of the Gospel through the lenses of encounter, discipleship and mission.

It draws on seminal documents on evangelisation from recent decades, including the teachings of Popes Paul VI, John Paul II, Benedict XVI and Francis.

'Almost 50 years ago, St Paul VI urged us to reflect on Christ the Evangeliser, but to also see ourselves as the evangelising Church,' said Archbishop Christopher Prowse, chair of the Bishops Commission for *Evangelisation, Laity and Ministry.*

" In recent years, the task of prophetic witness and convicted proclamation of the Gospel has increasingly been seen as the work of all the baptised, and we invite the faithful to reflect deeply and pray about that in this document. "

Evangelisation uses two well-known parables—the Samaritan woman at the well and the disciples on the road to Emmaus—as anchors for the consideration of the themes of encounter, discipleship and mission. 'By unpacking these familiar stories, and by contemplating how we encounter Jesus, how he made disciples and how we are called to be missionary, we can find ourselves challenged to be more and also to do more.

'The Bishops Commission felt compelled to provide something of a blueprint for evangelisation in our current context, and we commend it to the People of God as part of our journey, walking together.'

The document concludes with a reflection on St John Paul II's legacy as a proponent and practitioner of a spirit of evangelisation.

'There is an expression that could summarise the contribution of St John Paul II concerning evangelisation in general. It pertains to the fact that all the Church, and all the baptised, are to preach all the Gospel, including all Scripture and Tradition, to all the world,' the document states.

'We are a missionary people entering into the cultural worlds of our society and we do this all the time until Jesus comes again.

" In summary, all the Church, to preach all the Gospel, to all the world, all the time. "

The "Stay-at home" pilgrim: shrines to visit in Melbourne this WYD

A number of sacred shrines around Melbourne provide the opportunity to spiritually refresh ourselves and pray for Melbourne's WYD pilgrims. From various national shrines to St Patrick's Cathedral, why not make some time to visit some of Melbourne's beautiful religious sites. Keeping our pilgrims in prayer will be especially important as they head off to experience the Church as they've never experienced it before, and to encounter the Lord in a new and profound way.

Here are just a few of the local sites you could visit on your 'stayat-home' pilgrimage.

Our Lady of Ta'Pinu Shrine, 15 Flanagans Drive, Merrimu. National Shrine of Our lady of Mount Carmel, Richardson and Wright streets in Middle Park, and is open daily from 8.30am to 6pm.

National Shrine of St Therese of Lisieux, 94 Stevenson Street, Kew. Shrine of St Anthony, 182 Power Street, Hawthorn, open for private visits from Monday to Friday

St Patrick's Cathedral, The mother church of Melbourne, St Patrick's Cathedral is one of the best examples of Gothic Revival architecture in the southern hemisphere.

A Parish Endeavour - St Kevin's Hampton Park

Melbourne's World Youth Day journey officially gets underway this week, with the first pilgrimage group—the Footsteps of Jesus—scheduled to fly out on Wednesday 19 July. Fr Anil Mascherenhas, Assistant Parish Priest of St Kevin's Hampton Park, is one of the bus leaders on the pilgrimage, and has more than 30 parishioners from St Kevin's in tow. It's one of the largest parish groups to attend an overseas World Youth Day from the Archdiocese.

'We are blessed to have a parish filled with many young families, and we had more than a year's preparation for this WYD pilgrimage,' Fr Anil shares. While 33 pilgrims are attending as part of the Archdiocese's pilgrimage, a few more are travelling as part of other national groups such as Jesus Youth.

Fr Anil said he and the pilgrims have been overwhelmed by the support shown by their parish community. 'Over the last year we have had spiritual, social and fundraising events for the youth, where our parish community came together as one family to enable them to embark on this great opportunity,' he said. The pilgrimage to World Youth Day was seen as a whole-parish endeavour, with families assisting the youth to raise more than \$90,000 to go towards pilgrimage costs through fundraising events like dances, trivia nights, bake sales and more.

'This whole preparation not only brought our young people closer to their faith and the Church but also brought our parish families together, which enriched the vibrancy of our parish,' Fr Anil explains. And the pilgrims played their part, he says, committing to a series of spiritual preparation sessions over the past year, attending retreats, youth gatherings and regular Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and participating in the Pentecost Vigil.

The Footsteps of Jesus pilgrimage group will fly into Israel and head to Bethlehem, from where they will begin their exploration of the places that were central to Jesus' life and ministry. One of the St Kevin's pilgrims said she is looking forward to visiting the Holy Land for the first time and seeing the gospels come to life.

'I thought that visiting the Holy Land would be something I would do when I'm retired, but now is a great opportunity with a big group of my friends from St Kevin's Parish. When I return home and in church, I can visualise and connect more with the gospel readings because I will have been there!'

Fr Anil said he's looking forward to supporting the pilgrims as they deepen their understanding of their faith. 'I am excited to be their fellow pilgrim and to accompany them on their journey of faith in this Footsteps of Jesus pilgrimage. Our young people made attending World Youth Day their priority,

and so I am excited to witness how they will encounter Jesus in various ways.' He hopes that the World Youth Day experience will 'boost their love for the faith, and in particular their relationship with Jesus'.

'World Youth Day offers young people a lively and joyful experience of faith and communion,' he says. 'It offers a space to experience the beauty of the face of God. And as their bus leader, I am humbled by this opportunity to serve our young people on this pilgrimage in whatever way I can.'
