



Commitment to the Safety of Children and Young People

The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne's Statement of Commitment and Safeguarding Children and Young People . The Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy enacts the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne's mission-driven commitment to proactively protect the safety and wellbeing of children and young people. This policy:

- Sets out governance structures in relation to our responsibility to safeguard children and young people and ensure that all persons within the Archdiocese are aware of their responsibilities with respect to child safety.
- Establishes clear behavioral expectations for the care and protection of children and young people for clergy, employees and volunteers.
- Outlines policies, procedures and strategies to prevent child abuse and keep children and young people safe.
- Provides an overview of processes to respond to and report child abuse or child-safety related misconduct.
- Seeks to inform parents, children and young people of the measures that are in place to prevent and/or respond to safety concerns, reports and allegations.

In fulfilling our responsibilities, the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne has developed the <u>Safeguarding Children and Young People Framework</u> to guide the implementation of the child safety policies, procedures and practices within parishes, agencies and entities.

Feast day of St Francis of Assisi 4th October



It's unknown if Francis was born in 1181 or 1182, but historians agree that he was born in Italy to a wealthy cloth merchant — right into the lap of luxury. Though he was baptized Giovanni, when his father returned from France with a penchant for all things French, he began to be called 'Francesco,' meaning, 'Frenchman.' As a teenager and young adult, Francis lived a carefree, wealthy

lifestyle full of feasts and friends, yet he knew there was something missing.

To avoid his father, Francis lived in a cave in San Damiano, eventually renouncing his family and becoming a beggar. He gradually began to care for the poor and sick in Assisi. Soon, his preaching gathered him a following, and he founded the Friar's Minor. The noblewoman Clare of Assisi heard him speak and was inspired by his message and, with Francis's help, formed the order of the Poor Ladies, or the Poor Clares.

His last days were spent dictating his spiritual testament and he died on October 3, 1226. Two years later, he was pronounced a saint. The next day, the foundation for the Basilica of Saint Francis in Assisi was laid, and he was buried in a hidden tomb in the Lower Basilica on May 25, 1230.

<u>Carmelite Monastery of Melbourne celebrates 100</u> <u>years</u>

Origins of the Carmelite Monastery in Melbourne

In 1922, nuns of the Carmelite Monastery of Dulwich Hill, Sydney, obtained permission from the late Archbishop of Melbourne Daniel Mannix DD to establish a foundation in Melbourne. Two nuns from the Sydney Monastery, Mother Mary of the Holy Spirit and



Mother St John of the Cross (Foley), visited Melbourne and purchased 'Carrieal', a property in Mason Street, Hawthorn. Ten nuns formed the basis for the Melbourne foundation, and Mother St John of the Cross became the founding prioress. They left Sydney and travelled on the train to Melbourne, arriving 22 September. The estate agent, Mr Ernest Williams, and his family met them at Spencer Street Station and drove them to their future home in Mason Street.

When postulants started entering the community, the Hawthorn property became inadequate. So, during the years of the Great Depression, a new monastery was built in the nearby suburb of Kew, on Stevenson Street. The community moved there on 29 April 1929, while construction continued. It was built in the traditional Carmelite manner to include an internal cloister enclosed on three sides by living and working areas, and on the fourth side by a chapel, which was later erected as the Australian National Shrine to St Thérèse of Lisieux, who was canonised on 19 May 1925.

There is much to see when visiting the chapel. Inside, the two shrines (or side chapels) on either side of the nave are devoted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel and St Therese of Lisieux. The interior decorations in the chapel, with the exception of the stations of the cross, were completed for the consecration, which took place on 12 November 1931. Ten days later, the opening High Mass was celebrated by Archbishop Mannix, with Mary of the Holy Spirit of the Dulwich Hill Carmel—who had helped with the plans for the Melbourne foundation—travelling to Melbourne for the opening and encloistering ceremony.
