First Reading

A reading from the book of Exodus

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill.

As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

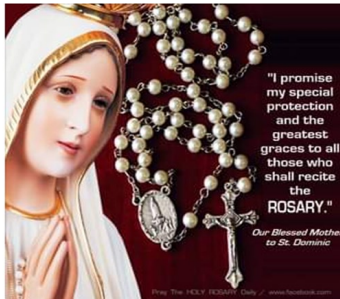
REFLECTION, for this week,

The early Christians were sure that the "Day of the Lord" was coming soon. This would be the day when the world they lived in, with its Roman rule and oppression, would end and a new world would come. This belief is rooted in Jewish tradition. God promised a new king from the line of David who would restore Israel.

But in today's parable, Jesus tells us that sometimes we have to wait. That doesn't mean giving up. But we must be persistent. Like the widow who is waiting for a just judgement from the corrupt judge, we must wait for the day when we live in the Kingdom of God. That day will come, but we must trust in God.

Sometimes we want immediate justice in our lives. When someone hurts us, we would like God to rain down justice upon them. But that doesn't always happen. We might be tempted to think that God does not hear us. He does, but God's ways are not our ways. We must have faith. And we must keep praying and trust that God is with us.

Feast of St Ignatius of Antioch - 17th October

On Oct. 17, the Roman Catholic Church remembers the early Church Father, bishop, and martyr Saint Ignatius of Antioch, whose writings attest to the sacramental and hierarchical nature of the Church from its earliest days. Eastern Catholics and Eastern Orthodox Christians celebrate his memory on Dec. 20.

Born in Syria in the middle of the first century A.D., Ignatius is said to have been personally instructed – along with another future martyr, Saint Polycarp – by the Apostle Saint John. When Ignatius became the Bishop of Antioch around the year 70, he assumed leadership of a local church that was, according to tradition, first led by Saint Peter before his move to Rome.

Feast day of St Luke, Evangelist—18th October

St Luke the Evangelist is the author of the canonical Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. He was born in the 1st century AD in Antioch, Syria. He was a disciple of St Paul the Apostle as well as a medical doctor.

He is believed to have died as a martyr at the age of 84 while other accounts say that he died in Thebes, Boeotia, in Greece where he had settled to write his Gospel.

SAFEGUARDING ESSENTIALS ONLINE TRAINING MODULE IS NOW LIVE.

The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Professional Standards Unit has announced the launch of the Safeguarding Essential online training module for volunteers.

The **Safeguarding Essentials online training** is a 30 min training module for volunteers within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne. Clergy and employees will be able to access the training module currently on Employment Hero.

The purpose of this training is to provide our volunteers with:

- foundational knowledge that will support them to undertake their role
- a clear understanding of their duty of care and expectations with regards to safeguarding children, young people and adults from all forms of abuse and harm

This will be:

- an annual requirement for everyone
- possible to complete individually online

At the completion of the training:

- participants will receive a certificate of completion
- the parish will also receive notification that the module has been completed successfully.

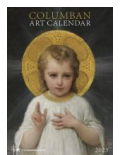

St Peter the Apostle Hoppers Crossing celebrates their Golden Jubilee

Marking a significant milestone provides an important opportunity to step back from the distractions of our daily lives and to take a longer, perhaps more appreciative view of the gracious and life-giving action of God among us. Last Sunday, the people of St Peter Apostle Mission Parish in Hoppers Crossing had just such an opportunity as they celebrated their golden jubilee, the 50th anniversary of the dedication and blessing of their church on 6 October 1972.

Integral to the life of the parish throughout this time have been the migrant groups who have made Hoppers Crossing their home, including flourishing Filipino, Polish, Samoan, Burmese, Malayalam and Spanish communities, all of whom have gathered at their own Masses over the years, supported by a host of visiting clergy. For the last 20 years, an annual multicultural Mass has been hosted by a different national group each year, and every Advent, a series of Spirit-filled Novena dawn Masses in the Filipino tradition, running from 16 to 24 December and led by the Katawan Ni Kristo (KNK) charismatic prayer community, have become a particular highlight of the community's calendar.
