A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Mt 17:1-9

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Eliiah appeared to them: they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' Reflection - Do not portray an out-of-body experience,


We have to get rid of the idea that the soul is a dot of energy in some hidden core of our body. In fact, the body is in the soul. There is no part of my body which is not immersed in my soul. It is my whole person, bodysoul, which needs to be saved.

As Thomas Aquinas says: 'If only my soul is saved, I am not saved.' Today's Gospel does not portray an out-of-body experience of religious ecstasy. Jesus' body was translucent, totally radiant with Divine Light. Further, this transfiguration was not a solitary experience for Jesus. Peter, James and John witnessed it precisely because it told them what our Heavenly Father desired as their destiny beyond martyrdom, if only they would listen to Jesus. Heavenly salvation will involve my whole person, bodysoul, being transformed. But could a person, during their earthly existence, share in the transfiguration experience of Christ?

We could pause for a moment to 'Google' or otherwise get hold of my favourite story of a saint – St Seraphim of Sarov – and pray that we may share with his disciple the bodily experience of 'immeasurable wellbeing' – 'infinite joy in our hearts'.

Melbourne Students Illustration

When year 4 student Peter, from Melbourne's south, submitted an entry to an international drawing competition last year, he may never have thought it would reach the Vatican. But after his illustration was



Last October, 15 schools from seven dioceses across Australia participated in a drawing competition to celebrate the 180th anniversary of the Society of the Holy Childhood, one of the four societies that make up Catholic Mission. The competition encouraged students to reflect on how Pope Francis inspires children to help other children.

Over 200 entries were submitted. The selection process involved shortlisting entries from each diocese that met the theme, and a winner was picked from each diocese. The final winning entry was chosen by Fr Brian Lucas, Catholic Mission National Director. An illustration by Peter, a year 4 student at Galilee Regional Catholic Primary School in South Melbourne, was chosen from a shortlist of ten finalists as the winning entry from Australia.

Peter's illustration, which uses bubbles to represent 'Hope', 'Teach' and 'Charity', shows the dynamic ways in which Pope Francis aims to inspire children by example. It will be published in a book of entries from children around the world and presented to the Holy Father himself in celebration of the anniversary.

The competition was also integrated as an activity

alongside <u>Socktober</u>, Catholic Mission's school- and communityengagement program.

'Socktober aims to bring Mission alive for students across Australia by engaging their talents and interests in various activities and to support other children who are in need,' says Matt Poynting, the program's coordinator. 'This was a fun activity on the side, and we were thrilled to see such broad and creative uptake among participating students.' Overall, the drawing competition was a huge success, with many children showcasing their talents and learning about the importance of helping others. Catholic Mission congratulates all the winners and participants.

Ancient and New: remembering the first Aboriginal Catholic Liturgy, 50 years on

Recently, on Friday 24 February, we marked the 50th anniversary of a momentous event in the life of the Australian Church. On the afternoon of Saturday 24 February 1973, the first Australian Aboriginal Liturgy



was celebrated as part of the 40th International Eucharistic Congress in Melbourne, which ran from 18 to 25 February.

The Mass drew nearly 30,000 people to the Sidney Myer Music Bowl. They came to participate in a liturgy that sought, in the words of its organisers, 'to express the Eucharistic Act in cultural and thought patterns of the Aboriginal peoples'. On the stage, and among the congregation, were hundreds of Aboriginal people, many of whom had travelled great distances for the opportunity to participate in a Mass that incorporated elements of their own spirituality and cultures, and that reflected some of their own experiences and expressions of their Catholic faith.

On the stage of the Music Bowl, at an altar constructed of bark and decorated with Aboriginal symbols, the Mass was celebrated by the Papal Legate and Archbishop of Baltimore, Lawrence Cardinal Shehan, robed in vestments featuring Aboriginal motifs.

Vicki Clark was a schoolgirl 'in pigtails' when she found herself in the congregation at the Music Bowl in 1973, having received a ticket as one of about 20 Aboriginal students in Melbourne's Catholic schools at that time:

A Mutthi Mutthi Wemba Wamba woman, she would go on to become the first coordinator of Aboriginal Catholic Ministry in Victoria, a position she held for more than 25 years.

"We've moved on in our culture; we've moved on in how we do things. It ain't going to be in that very unique way it was back in '73 ... What we are doing today is just as authentic as what they were doing back [then]. We do a different dance today, we sing different songs today, but it's no less Aboriginal"
