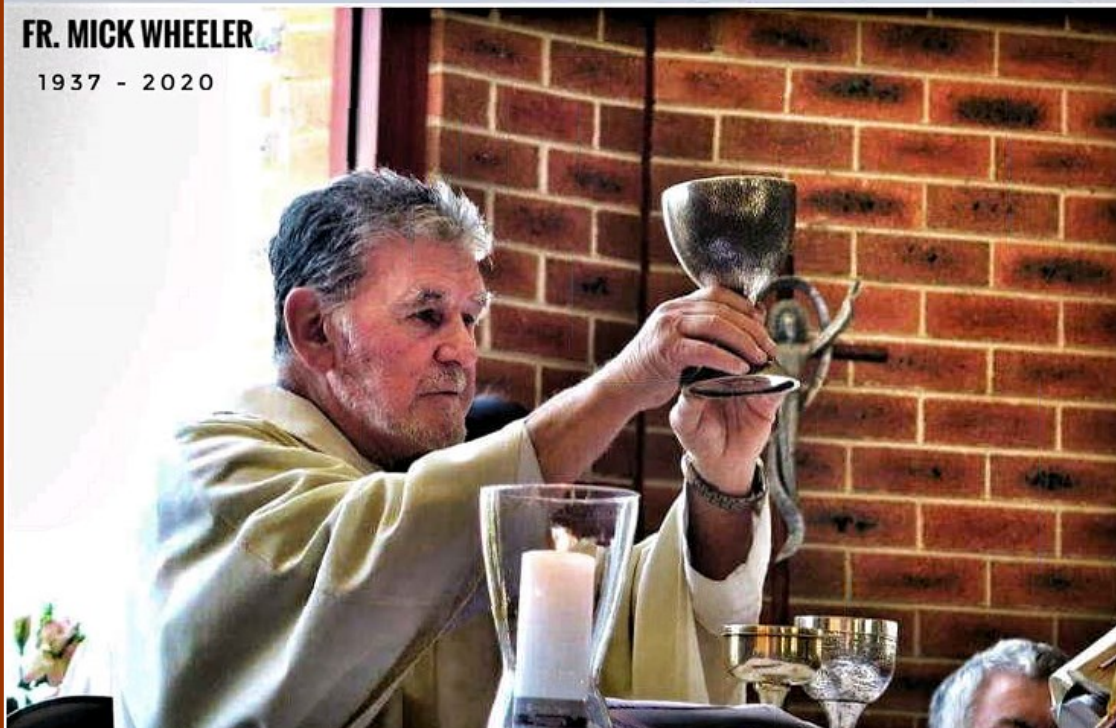

Memorial Mass for Fr. Michael Wheeler

FR. MICK WHEELER

1937 - 2020



Fr Michael was ordained a Catholic Priest at St Patrick's Cathedral, East Melbourne on the 22nd may 1971. he was appointed Assistant Priest at Belmont (December 1971—March 1972, Collingwood (1972), Jordanville (1975) Manifold (1978) and Newport (1979). He was then appointed as Chaplain to the Repatriation Hospital, Heidelberg in 1981

Then appointed Parish Priest of the newly established parish of Wheelers Hill in 1986.

In 2016. Fr Michael retired and was appointed Pastor Emeritus.

He passed away peacefully on the 11th of August 2020

St Justin's community is most grateful for his generous time and care given to his people with a good sense of humor.

'O God, listen favourably to our prayers offered on behalf of your servant and priest, and grant that Michael, who committed himself zealously to the service of your name, may rejoice forever in the company of your saints. We ask this through our Lord. Amen '

SAFEGUARDING ESSENTIALS ONLINE TRAINING MODULE IS NOW LIVE.

The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Professional Standards Unit has announced the launch of the Safeguarding Essential online training module for volunteers.

The **Safeguarding Essentials online training** is a 30 min training module for volunteers within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne. Clergy and employees will be able to access the training module currently on Employment Hero.

The purpose of this training is to provide our volunteers with:

- foundational knowledge that will support them to undertake their role
- a clear understanding of their duty of care and expectations with regards to safeguarding children, young people and adults from all forms of abuse and harm

This will be:

- an annual requirement for everyone
- possible to complete individually online

At the completion of the training:

- participants will receive a certificate of completion
- the parish will also receive notification that the module has been completed successfully.
