SAFEGUARDING ESSENTIALS ONLINE TRAINING MODULE IS NOW LIVE.

The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Professional Standards Unit has announced the launch of the Safeguarding Essential online training module for volunteers.

The **Safeguarding Essentials online training** is a 30 min training module for volunteers within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne. Clergy and employees will be able to access the training module currently on Employment Hero.

The purpose of this training is to provide our volunteers with:

- foundational knowledge that will support them to undertake their role
- a clear understanding of their duty of care and expectations with regards to safeguarding children, young people and adults from all forms of abuse and harm

This will be:

- an annual requirement for everyone
- possible to complete individually online

At the completion of the training:

- participants will receive a certificate of completion
- the parish will also receive notification that the module has been completed successfully.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, 8th December



"The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin."

In 1854, Pope Pius IX's solemn declaration, "Ineffabilis Deus," clarified with finality the long-held belief of the Church that Mary was conceived free from original sin. Mary was granted this extraordinary privilege because of

Her unique role in history as the Mother of God. That is, she received the gift of salvation in Christ from the very moment of her conception. Even though Mary is unique in all humanity for being born without sin, she is held up by the Church as a model for all humanity in Her holiness and Her purity in her willingness to accept the Plan of God for her.

"The word of the Lord came to me thus: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you." (Jeremiah 1:5-6)

Advent: a guide for the perplexed



Advent is not only one of the great seasons of the Church's year; it's the *beginning* of the new liturgical year, though maybe it doesn't always feel that way. For some of us, perhaps, Advent is not a season we fully engage with. As the work year hurtles towards its conclusion and we get caught up in all the busyness, Advent tends to recede into the background.

But Advent is supposed to be a time of spiritual renewal: a chance to start again, to come home if we've drifted away, to rediscover the joy of knowing Jesus Christ. Jesus comes to make his home among us and within us. Advent offers us a chance to rediscover this. So it's worth spending some time thinking about what Advent is, why it exists and how we might enter into it more intentionally.

What does "Advent" mean?

The word *advent* comes from the old Latin word *adventus*, which refers to an 'arrival, an approach or a coming'. In the context of the leadup to Christmas, it refers to the coming of Christ. Which coming though? Traditionally, as St Bernard of Clairvaux pointed out, there are three 'comings' of Christ at the heart of Advent spirituality:

We know that the coming of the Lord is threefold ... The first coming was in flesh and weakness, the middle coming is in spirit and power, and the final coming will be in glory and majesty.

During Advent, as we remember the first coming of Christ in the Incarnation, we enter into the experience of Old Testament Israel, recalling the many years of waiting for the Messiah, and the fulfilment of their hopes in the little baby in Nazareth.

We also look ahead to the final coming of Christ 'in glory and majesty', anticipating the transfiguration of all creation in Christ, the Last Judgment and the joy of heaven.

What St Bernard refers to as the 'middle coming' is Christ's coming here and now, especially through the sacrament of the Eucharist. Christ's coming is a sacramental and spiritual coming, but it is also a real coming—which is why we speak of 'the *real* presence'. Christ lives in our midst, making his home among us. Christian discipleship means living as if that is true.
