## **First Reading**

#### A reading from the prophet Isaiah

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse, a scion thrusts from his roots: on him the spirit of the Lord rests, a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. (The fear of the Lord is his breath.) He does not judge by appearances, he gives no verdict on hearsay, but judges the wretched with integrity, and with equity gives a verdict for the poor of the land.

His word is a rod that strikes the ruthless, his sentences bring death to the wicked. Integrity is the loincloth round his waist, faithfulness the belt about his hips.

The wolf lives with the lamb, the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion cub feed together with a little boy to lead them. The cow and the bear make friends, their young lie down together.

The lion eats straw like the ox. The infant plays over the cobra's hole; into the viper's lair the young child puts his hand. They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain, for the country is filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea.

That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations and its home will be glorious.

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' This was the man the prophet Isaiah spoke of when he said:

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But when he saw a number of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowingfan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.'

The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Professional Standards Unit has announced the launch of the Safeguarding Essential online training module for volunteers.

The **Safeguarding Essentials online training** is a 30 min training module for volunteers within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne. Clergy and employees will be able to access the training module currently on Employment Hero.

The purpose of this training is to provide our volunteers with:

- foundational knowledge that will support them to undertake their role
- a clear understanding of their duty of care and expectations with regards to safeguarding children, young people and adults from all forms of abuse and harm

#### This will be:

- an annual requirement for everyone
- · possible to complete individually online

At the completion of the training:

- participants will receive a certificate of completion
- the parish will also receive notification that the module has been completed successfully.

## YOUTH TOGETHER

## Bringing the Christmas Spirit,



On the 26th of November, as the entire state of Victoria went to the Polls, the Youth Ministry showed up at St Justin Parish for another reason. There were 14 youths who turned up that Saturday morning, foregoing their usual extracurricular activities or for some, their only opportunity to sleep in. The youths worked together with Father Andrew and parishioners to set up and decorate the two Christmas trees on the altar as well as the foyer of the church. The Nativity scene was recreated with the Crib taking its usual pride of place at the front corner of the Church.

There was some heavy lifting, gamely undertaken by the Dads who assisted in this endeavour. Christmas lights were deftly untangled by nimble fingers and patient spirits. Missing thumb tacks were tracked down so that the Nativity Crib had the appropriate backdrop and covering. Tinsel was seen draped over some youths, that ultimately made it to the base of the tree where it belonged. Animated discussions were heard regarding placement of each decoration, with the Star of David taking a different position this year.

All of this was done in just under an hour, with lots of excited chatter and camaraderie that was heartening to witness. It represented a coming together of the young and not-so-young of our community to herald the joyous Season of Advent.

## Feast of the Immaculate Conception, 8th December

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is one of the most prominent Marian feasts in the Catholic Church, but also a tricky one when it comes to relationships with other Churches. Even the other traditions that venerate the Mother of God are hesitant to refer to her conception as "immaculate," although there is a long history of this teaching within western Catholicism. The origins of this teaching, and the solemn feast associated with it, are complicated. Different traditions have varying interpretations about Our Lady and her relationship to sin, but



they all share the view that the woman chosen to be the Mother of God was exceptionally pure and holy.

A feast day celebrating the conception of the Mother of God is thought to have begun in the East from around the 7th or 8th centuries. It was not specified at this point that Our Lady's conception was "immaculate," meaning that she was without original sin from the moment she was conceived in her mother's womb. St. Augustine of Hippo and his understanding of original sin is not nearly as prominent in Eastern Christianity as it is in the West, so it wasn't until the feast day made its way into the Western Church that the notion of the Immaculate Conception began to develop.

Our Lady declared, "I am the Immaculate Conception," a statement Bernadette did not really understand, but it seemed to confirm the validity of her visions, considering she was thought to be a simple-minded girl without much knowledge of Church teaching.


