
Reflection,

When he was crucified Jesus uttered: 'It is finished.' What had finished?

His earthly ministry during which he painted a picture of the most intimate communion between Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, so intimate that the Church needed a new word: 'TriUnity' or 'Trinity' for short. God is pulsating, shimmering light, dancing in threefold exchange of love, each being simultaneously poured into the other. God is 'Being-In-Love' and love is always relational. 'You are made in the image and likeness of God'?

Because of the ministry of Jesus Christ, we know what that really means. We are made to live in relationship – not in solitary.

If we think that the ultimate good is to be self-sufficient/autonomous, that leads to a hellish existence. When we live with as much selfgiving as is possible, we are on the way to a heavenly existence. We could pause for a moment to give thanks for the revelation of the nature of God, and consequently of the true nature of human beings.

5 takeaways from Vatican 11"s Decree on Ecumenism

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity runs from 29 May to 5 June. It's a chance to pray with Christ that his Church might be 'one'. As we consider what this means, the Second Vatican Council's decree on ecumenism, *Unitatis Redintegratio*, outlines many helpful principles Catholics can draw on in their work on ecumenism.

The publication of the decree is widely recognised to have been a landmark moment, a fresh articulation of how Catholics should think about and engage with other Christian traditions and denominations. Here are five key takeaways from the document.

The right to be called Christian

Central to *Unitatis Redintegratio* is the principle that if somebody has been baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, they have a 'right' to be called Christian. Baptism is an immersion into the life of the crucified and risen Lord and, therefore, the life of the 'new creation', as St Paul calls it (2 Corinthians 5:17).

According to the decree, even if they are not in full communion with the Catholic Church and haven't experienced full integration into the life of grace that comes with full sacramental participation, they are members of the Body of Christ and therefore 'accepted as brothers by the children of the Catholic Church' (§3)—'separated', but brothers and sisters nevertheless.

Although there are 'varying degrees' of differences between Catholicism and other Christian denominations—some more serious than others—this principle of baptism is the beginning of how we should see our fellow brothers and sisters in the Lord.

Moreover, God continues to use these Christian communities to draw people to salvation.

It follows that the separated Churches and Communities as such, though we believe them to be deficient in some respects, have been by no means deprived of significance and importance in the mystery of salvation. For the Spirit of Christ has not refrained from using them as means of salvation which derive their efficacy from the very fullness of grace and truth entrusted to the Church

WYD: 50 days to departure!

Wednesday 31 May 2023, the feast of the Visitation, marks 50 days until Melbourne's pilgrims travel to the Church's largest international youth gathering: World Youth Day. This year the event is being hosted by Lisbon, Portugal, with an expected one million pilgrims travelling from around the world to be there.

Melbourne is pleased to be sending more than 500 pilgrims, from more than 50 parishes and 40 schools from across the Archdiocese—our largest ever overseas group! To manage such a big group, 130 of these pilgrims have assumed leadership roles as chaplains, pilgrimage coordinators, first aiders, mental health specialists, nurses and small group leaders.

As the excitement builds, pilgrims are joining with their communities and asking them to pray that this time of practical and spiritual preparation will be fruitful, that they will encounter Jesus and return to enliven their homes, parishes, schools and communities.

Fr Daryl Montecillo, one of the chaplains on the pilgrimage, has encouraged the pilgrims to 'be open to the unexpected' through the experience. 'I've been blessed to go [to World Youth Day] twice, and some of the best experiences were completely unplanned.'

'My real hope is that they get to encounter our Lord, to meet Jesus and to share him with others where they return to,' he says.

This 50-day period will be a special one. You are invited to join in prayer with communities throughout the Archdiocese that this will be a time of grace for our pilgrims and our local communities as they journey together in faith.

What's next?

The next session for the pilgrims will be on 5 June, when they find out what small groups they are in for the duration of the pilgrimage.
