We are excited to announce the commencement of a ReachOut Ministry in our Parish this year.

What is a ReachOut Ministry?

The vision of this Ministry is to have parishioners of St Justin's involved in a ReachOut community, meet monthly to share life and faith in a small group setting and thereby growing in Spiritual love.

These groups will help us:

- Learn to missionary disciples bringing Jesus Christ to others in the world:
- Allow members to know one another and foster a sense of belonging not experienced in a large Parish setting; and
- Facilitate quick and effective mobilization of parishioners for important larger events and parish level initiatives.

"Our Pilgrims in FATIMA"



Over the weekend, from Saturday 29 to Sunday 30 August, pilgrims on the Italian Way and Holy Land pre–World Youth Day pilgrimages converged on Fatima, visiting the shrine commemorating Our Lady's apparition to three young Portuguese children in the early 20th century.

Pilgrims in the 'Direct to Lisbon' group were able to explore the main town and attended Mass in the main square, celebrated by Cardinal Sean O'Malley of the Archdiocese of Boston. Later in the day, the pilgrims gathered for a private Mass at the Chapel of the Death of Jesus at the Shrine of Fatima, where Bishop Anthony (Tony) Ireland unpacked the significance of the Sunday gospel.

Reflecting on the parable of the merchant looking for the pearl of great price (Matthew 13:44–52), Bishop Ireland said, 'On the lips of Jesus, we find the kingdom of God is the merchant looking, and when he finds one of value, he gives up everything for it. So if God is the merchant looking for fine pearls, what are the fine pearls? ... Who are the fine pearls? And the answer is: you.'

"Perhaps you've not thought of yourself as a fine pearl that is worth spending everything God owns on ... That's exactly what he has done. And you are worth it. "

On Sunday evening, pilgrims took part in the evening candlelit procession that takes place every night in Fatima after a 10pm Rosary, starting at the Chapel of Apparitions and processing through the main square. Four pilgrims from Melbourne helped to carry the statue of Our Lady through the crowds.

All of Melbourne's pre-pilgrimage groups are now starting to make their way to Lisbon, where they will join scores of young Catholics from around the world for the 16th international World Youth Day.





National Vocations Awareness Week



National Vocations Awareness Week – Vocations come from families, communities and parishes. Strong families and communities are the place where vocations are first nurtured.

In this National Vocations Awareness Week, let us pray for all families in our parish, and for those preparing for marriage. Let us also pray that our parish community may always be welcoming and encouraging of vocations to marriage, priesthood and consecrated life.

Feast of St Mary of the Cross (Mackillop) - 8th Aug

Mary MacKillop was born in 1842 in Fitzroy, Melbourne. On 8 August 1909, she died, having suffered a disabling stroke in 1902. Inspired by a meeting with Fr. Julian Tenison-Woods, Mary MacKillop took her vows at the age of twenty five, and the religious name, "Mary of the Cross". In doing so, she founded the congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph. Soon after taking her religious vows, Mary MacKillop founded



several schools. Within five years of taking her vows and founding the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, Mary had established over thirty schools in South Australia. By that time, more than one hundred women had joined the Sisters of Saint Joseph.

Mary MacKillop was very conscious of the plight of the poor and needy. She worked with families that lived in isolated areas of Australia. As a result, Mary MacKillop pioneered a new form of religious life in Australia, and commenced a "system" of "Josephite" schools that would provide education, especially for the children of the poor. In 1873, Pope Pius IX gave Papal approval for the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph.

She was declared a Saint by Pope Benedict XVI on the 17th October 2010. In January 2013, St Mary of the Cross (MacKillop) was declared by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, to be the Second Patron Saint of Australia. This means that Australia now has two Patron Saints: Mary Help of Christians and St. Mary of the Cross (MacKillop).
