
Weekday Masses has resumed in our 3 Parishes.

MASSES AT ST MARY'S DURING COVID RESTRICTIONS -

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM FR STEVEN RIGO AND JACINTA BRIGHT

These are very difficult times for all of us as we keep continue to find ways to be Church; a Eucharistic community who embraces all, given the challenges with COVID. There are differing beliefs and opinions about what the Government should be doing and what the Church should be doing and what we as individuals should be doing. Sadly, differ-

ences can fracture families and communities. Here is our challenge – how do we live with the differences, respecting the dignity of each person by trying to understand and reach out to one another. Misinformation can exacerbate division – yet we are called to be reconciled and reconcilers. It is important that we have conversations that lead to understanding.

Just to clarify any confusion, St Mary's is not paddling its own boat in relation to the current restrictions. We are following State Government requirements, which are handed down to us from the Archdiocese – and these requirements are very specific. Other parishes have at times not adhered to the requirements, which has made it difficult for us. We have been accused of being too strict, or of not caring about our people, or of being discriminatory.

Quite apart from our following the regulations because we are asked to do so, it is our Christian mandate to protect the vulnerable. If that's not enough - places of worship can incur significant fines if found to be not complying with regulations, as you can see on this link: <u>https://www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/covidsafe-religion-and-ceremonies-guidance</u>

Victoria Police and Department of Health Authorised Officers regularly check places of worship for compliance with current restrictions.

We are doing all we can to hold our community as one, despite the tensions around us. Our Liturgy Team, together with a small band of volunteers, have made themselves available in order to carry out the task of sanitisers and Check In Marshals, roles that are required by the State Government. Two members in particular, have come to several Masses each weekend since COVID began, so that we can continue to comply, otherwise we wouldn't be able to have Mass. We don't have enough volunteers so they step up selflessly.

Please understand that although there may be dissatisfaction with some measures taken, there is a bigger picture here for parishes and organisations and we are doing our very best to comply – not only because we are required to do so, but because we are always to support the most vulnerable, including the many elderly and the immuno-compromised amongst us, and also those who choose to remain unvaccinated for whatever reason that is important to them. Let's be aware of how we might be people of reconciliation in a world in which surely needs that grace.

<u>FIRST EUCHARIST AT ST MARY'S</u> We congratulate the children who will be receiving the Sacrament of First Eucharist this weekend and pray that they will always be guided by the Lord throughout their lives.

FIRST EUCHARISTS will be celebrated on the weekends of 27/28 November and 4/5 December. In relation to 5.00pm Mass. If you are doubly vaccinated and usually go to 5.00pm Mass, please consider coming to a different Mass on these two weekends. The reason is that, if the restrictions for people of unknown vaccination status still apply, we will have some families (to a maximum of three families) with immediate family members only, coming to those 5.00pm Masss for their child's First Eucharist - and therefore may only have 15 places for others of unknown vaccination status at that Mass, on both weekends. As this is the only Mass where people of unknown vaccination status of them.

Support Group for people experiencing anxiety during this COVID transition time Whilst, as a society, we navigate coming out of lockdown, anxiety seems heightened, for various reasons. Whether we are vaccinated or not, and for whatever reasons we make our choices, we are all human and we are all made in the dignity and likeness of God. At a time when there is a danger of judging, let us be a community of compassion. This is an invitation for anyone feeling anxious at the moment, to come along to a small support group in the parish. It isn't a therapy group. It's a support group. There will be some ground-rules, such as confidentiality and listening, but also no discussion about politics or conspiracy theories. Whilst some who are anxious hold certain beliefs about the vaccine, that others don't, this needs

to be a space where we find compassion and care and support and respect – and perhaps a sense that we are not alone, and that all will be well. The season of Advent begins today. It is the season of new beginnings: the start of the new liturgical year, the birth of Jesus, the beginning of summer. It is also a time for reflection about the coming of Jesus into our lives through grace and the sacraments, and a time to keep in mind that He will come again.

ADVENT

The theme for Advent this year is Witnessing to New Beginnings. This is such an appropriate theme for this year as we begin to emerge from lockdown and the damaging effects of the coronavirus pandemic. Our lives have changed: how we interact with family, friends, neighbours, the general community; how we work, learn, play and socialise; how we worship and experience our faith community; how we feel safe in our world and how we find ways to rebuild confidence, trust and hope in living a full life. During this time of Advent we move forward in the knowledge that God is with us as we rebuild our relationships and connections to others and open up to the new opportunities that are waiting.

Rebirth, renewal and the awakening of possibilities are themes also as the Plenary Council continues to deliberate what the Church in Australia is called to be in the future, and at a local level we are considering how we want our parishes to be structured to enable vibrant, faithful and committed communities to care for their own and to reach out to others. Many new beginnings to enliven our hearts and spirits.

Each week we light a candle, symbolising that Jesus is coming, and place it in the Advent Wreath. In the first week we bless the wreath and light the first candle, a purple candle representing Hope. We remember the prophets in the Old Testament who foretold the birth of Christ.

LECTIONARY ART AND REFLECTION BY JENNY CLOSE

This Advent, our season of waiting begins with a dramatic foretelling of Christ's second coming. The signs that herald this event are on a cosmic scale and in line with the multi-layered imagery of Luke's infancy narrative. The signs are frightening and many will panic when the celestial bodies and the waters of the earth behave erratically – when the natural laws no longer apply. We must 'stay awake' and renew our lives through prayer and moral living in readiness for the end times.

First Sunday of Advent, Year C

First Reading Jer 33:14-16

I will cause a good seed to spring forth from David.

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I am going to fulfil the promise I made to the House of Israel and the House of Judah:

- 'In those days and at that time,
- I will make a virtuous Branch grow for David,
- who shall practise honesty and integrity in the land.

In those days Judah shall be saved and Israel shall dwell in confidence. And this is the name the city will be called:

The Lord-our-integrity.'

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Sometimes our own lives, the life of the Church, the life of societies and nations cry out for Our Lord Jesus Christ to come again right now and rescue us right now.

In some instances we can become conscious of Jesus' saving. transforming power in a particular situation. But, for the whole of humanity across the millennia, we do not know the day or the hour when death and all its warriors such as disease and violence, will be absolutely vanguished by Christ in glory.

This can lead to a type of pain which finds solace in all those things which dull the spirit. Our Lord gives examples: debauchery, drunkenness. Today he might have added 'living in the virtual world'. Rather, Our Lord wants us to live in the real world on high alert.

In the meantime each one of us can be a signal of what is to come. Each time we exhaust ourselves heroically loving someone whom others might abandon, each time we take a risk because we cry out against injustice, and in a myriad other ways, we signal that the Kingdom is already being established on earth.

We could pause for a moment to pray for the strength to be on high alert for the opportunities to translate the legacy of Jesus into our own time and place, thus giving reasons to each other for our faith and hope that Christ *has* come, Christ *is* risen, Christ *will* come again.
