


2021 COLUMBAN ART CALENDAR

FROM FR DIXON GEORGE

Dear Parishioners.

I hope you are all keeping well and feeling a little more upbeat now that we start to see some light at the end of this pandemic. My name is Fr Dixon George. I belong to a congregation called Voluntas Dei Institute founded in Trois-Rivières, Quebec, Canada in 1958 by Rev. Father Louis-Marie Parent, OMI.

I entered Voluntas Dei seminary following graduation and completed the necessary requirements for the priesthood and was ordained in Kerala, India in 2014. My first appointment was as an assistant parish priest at Our Lady of Assumption Church in Kerala. After two and a half years, I served as a Vocation Promoter of Voluntas Dei institute.

I came to Australia to serve in the Archdiocese of Melbourne on 10th April 2018. I undertook a period of induction before my first appointment. I was appointed as an Assistant Parish Priest at Our Lady's Church, Craigieburn.

Archbishop Peter Comensoli has recently appointed me as an Assistant Parish Priest to St. Mary's, Greensborough, Sacred Heart, Diamond Creek and St. Thomas the Apostle, North Greensborough. I will commence my new life on 18th November and live with Fr. Tao at St. Thomas'.

As a Voluntas Dei member, I strive for personal holiness by living the charism and spirituality of Voluntas Dei in the world as salt, light and leaven in the dough based on the Gospel message and social justice. I seek to welcome and live God's will as best as possible, to sow around me peace and fraternity in Jesus Christ.

I beg your prayers for me and implore the Lord's blessings upon you and your families and look forward to coming to know you. Fr Dixon

FR OWEN DOYLE

As some of you may already know, my Dad had a fall in his house on last Tuesday and was taken to Box Hill hospital by ambulance.

He had skin tears and abrasions on his head and said his neck hurt a little bit.

Scans were done late Tuesday night to find he has two small fractures in C1 & C2, in his neck.

He will have to wear a neck brace for three months and will have an x-ray in six weeks and a CT scan in three months.

We are hoping he will be moved in a few days to a rehabilitation centre which will be good.

At this stage he isn't able to take phone calls as you can imagine he is very restricted in his movement.

He is in good spirits but will be happier once he can move about and do things for himself.

CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS

We are very excited to let you know that the Safeguarding Risk Management Fundamentals e-learning videos are now available on the website.

Co-facilitated by the Professional Standards Unit and Catholic Church Insurance, the Safeguarding Risk Management Fundamentals e-Learning video modules are designed to increase your awareness of safeguarding risks within your parish and develop your understanding of how to conduct a risk assessment.

The content is presented over three 20 minute modules, providing a step-by-step demonstration of the risk management process to identify, analyse and address possible risks to provide safe physical and online environments for children and young people.

All Saints 1 November 2020

First Reading Rv 7:2-4. 9-14

I saw an immense crowd, beyond hope of counting, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language.

I, John, saw another angel rising where the sun rises, carrying the seal of the living God; he called in a powerful voice to the four angels whose duty was to devastate land and sea, 'Wait before you do any damage on land or at sea or to the trees, until we have put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God.' Then I heard how many were sealed: a hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel.

After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, 'Victory to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels who were standing in a circle round the throne, surrounding the elders and the four animals, prostrated themselves before the throne, and touched the ground with their foreheads, worshipping God with these words, 'Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.'

One of the elders then spoke, and asked me, 'Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes, and where they have come from?' I answered him, 'You can tell me, my Lord.' Then he said, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb.'

they shall be called sons of God.


Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right:

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

How can those suffering grinding poverty such that their whole personality is impoverished – the poor in spirit – be 'Blessed'? How can those who hunger and thirst for justice be 'Blessed'? The answer lies in the new community which Our Lord is establishing under the reign of God.

There are people within this new society who do everything possible to lift the poor out of poverty, to comfort those who are mourning, to make sure the gentle share in the earth's resources, to satisfy the craving for justice. These are 'saints' who are merciful, pure in heart, makers of peace.

The full measure of authentic humanity is Jesus Christ. But there are millions, only a few celebrated in the Church's calendar, who have tried to measure up to the challenge presented by the Teacher of the Beatitudes. These are saints, those who know that they cannot help create the Beatitude society out of some political ideology, but who wholeheartedly respond to the teaching of the One whose Holy Spirit can empower rising to the challenge.

We might pause a moment to pray that God may deal with us mercifully as we fall short of the full stature of the One who embodied the Beatitudes, at the same time as we celebrate the lives of the countless many who have measured up superlatively, the saints whose feast day we celebrate.
