

LECTIONARY ART REFLECTION by Jenny Close 4th Sunday of Advent Year B

In last week's gospel, John used 'light' as a divine attribute; but in Luke's Annunciation 'the power of the Most High' covered Mary 'with its shadow'. It seems ironic that both light and shadow can be aspects of God. These seemingly conflicting motifs are examples of the human urge to devise metaphors which evoke the divine, even though we know that God can never be fully expressed in words or images.

In Luke's Annunciation, Mary is somewhere between the light and the shadow. Here the shadow has a protective, nurturing quality. Here too opposites are reconciled in God (flesh and spirit, light and shadow) 'for nothing is impossible to God'.

Dr Jennifer Close has qualifications in Fine Arts and education. She gained here PhD in Theology from Griffith University. She has extensive experience creating liturgical art, and teaching theology. Her particular interests are in Liturgy and Sacramental Theology.

UPDATE GENERAL LITURGICAL GUIDELINES

- Face coverings throughout the celebration of Mass and the reception of Holy Communion are no mandatory.
- Record keeping is still required for all attendees at Mass.
- People must carry a face covering at all times. If a distance of 1.5m cannot be maintained, either indoor or outdoors, then face coverings must be worn (unless they are people that live with each other, or have a lawful reason or are children under 12 years of age.

Distribution of Communion

- Required 1.5 metres distancing between Communicants is maintained in the queue.
- Hands must be sanitized before receiving Communion.
- Sanitiser will be placed in the Church.
- The host is placed in outstretched and flat hands.
- Please return to your seat via a different pathway trying to maintain distancing



Partnered Parish Plenary Facilitator Group Update

December 2020

The Partnered Parishes Plenary Facilitators Group has continued to meet and discuss its plans and actions in advancing the cause of implementing the local actions raised during Stages one and two of the plenary meetings held in the parishes.

Below are some outcomes worked on during the year:

1. Outreach to Secondary School Students

Work is currently being done in relation to Secondary Schools and the students, in order to facilitate ways in which parishes and schools can work more closely together in the areas of faith, liturgy and social justice. The hope is that students may be encouraged to continue this work into life after school. There is a School Leaders Liturgy event being planned for term 2 in 2021.

2. Gospel Reflections

Our group is engaged in an initiative with the combined liturgy team of Sacred Heart and St Thomas leading, that is consistent with some of the sentiments coming out of the Plenary discernment: greater involvement of the laity in liturgy. There is a pilot of gospel reflections using a simple and user friendly system called Faith Circles We gather via a conferencing method (Zoom) and discuss the next Sunday's Gospel, its meaning to us and how it applies to our daily lives. In 2021 this will be offered to all members of the three partnered parishes via a notice in the parish bulletin.

3.Governance

We have completed a document about Governance, Statement of Intent and Model of the way the Plenary Facilitators Group works, recognizing that it is absolutely essential to how the church operates at all levels, including the parishes. This document will be available on each Parish's website.

A submission on the subject of Church Governance has been sent to the Plenary Council for inclusion in submissions at the Assembly from this group.

4. Other Matters

Consistent with some responses form parishioners, parishes are looking at developing pastoral councils across St Thomas and Sacred Heart and this is supported by the Plenary Facilitators Group.

This group will continue working next year responding to recommendations coming from the Listening and Discernment Process and to follow the Plenary Process on a National Level.

Fourth Sunday of Advent, Year B

20 December 2020

First Reading 2 Sm 7:1-5. 8-12. 14. 16

The kingdom of David will be established for ever in the sight of the Lord.

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent'. Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.'

But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan:

'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. I will provide a place for my people Israel; I will plant them there and they shall dwell in that place and never be disturbed again; nor shall the wicked continue to oppress them as they did, in the days when I appointed judges over my people Israel; I will give them rest from all their enemies. The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a House. And when your days are ended and you are laid to rest with your ancestors, I will preserve the offspring of your body after you and make his sovereignty secure. I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me and your throne be established for ever."

Second Reading Rom 16:25-27

The mystery kept secret for endless ages is now revealed.

Glory to him who is able to give you the strength to live according to the Good News I preach, and in which I proclaim Jesus Christ, the revelation of a mystery kept secret for endless ages, but now so clear that it must be broadcast to pagans everywhere to bring them to the obedience of faith. This is only what scripture has predicted, and it is all part of the way the eternal God wants things to be. He alone is wisdom; give glory therefore to him through Jesus Christ for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel Acclamation Lk 1:38

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the servant of the Lord: may his will for me be done. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 1:26-38

You will conceive and bear a son.

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.

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Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Luke's account of the Annunciation draws on the Jewish tradition describing creation: 'There was darkness over the deep and God's Spirit hovered over the water. God said: "Let there be light". and there was (Genesis 1:2-3) St Luke depicts Mary hearing in the depths of her soul: 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow.'

The Holy Spirit hovers over this young Jewish woman so that the most stupendously creative act in human history can take place. With her consent, God assumes human nature to be gradually enfleshed, embodied, in Mary's womb.

A naturally bewildered young woman was able to respond to God's will because she understood the imagery and the symbolism of the Genesis Story. We, in turn, need to read the Gospels in all their Jewishness so that we can understand when God's Holy Spirit hovers over our lives, asking us to fulfil some particular role in the Divine Plan.

We could pause for a moment to ask whether *now* is the time for a Marian response: 'Be it done unto me according to your word.'

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
