# Fr STEVEN RIGO-Summary of Clergy Conference

Last week I attended the annual Melbourne Clergy Conference held at the RACV resort at Cape Schanck & I thought I'd let you in on some of what we heard from presenters. This is one of few affordable venues that can accommodate 150 priests and deacons who attended.

The first presenter was Dr Claudio Betti, a founder of the Sant'Egidio Community, a lay Catholic association, established in Rome in 1968. Its first members were a group of high school students who joined forces to pray & work together for the poor & marginalised. From these humble beginnings, it has grown into an international lay movement, with some 40,000 members in all five continents. Apart from charitable works, Dr Betti & the Sant'Egidio Community have been involved in efforts to mediate on behalf of victims of civil war & other conflicts in such places as Lebanon & the Middle East, Mozambique; to engage in inter-religious dialogue, including the International Meetings of People & Religions at Assisi; & to carry out rescue operations on behalf of refugees. Dr. Betti is also the Director of the Rome Campus of Australian Catholic University.

Dr. Betti's emphasis was on the need for a new paradigm for a new time for our pastoral mission. He spoke about our living in a time of crisis & in a time of wars – the old world is dying & a new one is emerging, & in this twilight time when it has seeped into society that war, which reinforces hatred between peoples, is the solution for conflicts, there is a desperate need for prophets to instigate change & renewal of the world through prayer, commitment to the poor & peace-making through interreligious dialogue. The Church, as the sacrament of unity of the human race can have much to say in the complex world we live in today. We are called to offer a new language, a new paradigm that the world needs today. He emphasised the need to read the signs of the times. He explored one of them, namely how our society has become more polarised, divided & violent. In this context we need to be creative & courageous & become Church – the Body of Christ for the sake of the world. This begins with prayer on the scriptures, leading to encounter with Jesus & reaching out to the poor & those on the peripheries. He also emphasised that it is not hostility to the Church which is the main obstacle to our mission, but rather religious illiteracy & ignorance. To engage them we need a new language such as respect, courage, peace, unity & love - which is a universal language. My reflection on this is that God is present out there & whatever enhances the human spirit is the spirit of God & whatever crushes the human spirit is of the evil one. An obvious area of engagement is our schools where both the leadership, staff & families desperately need our help to encounter Jesus & open the scriptures to them & the richness of our traditions.

In the afternoon, Joshua Lourensz's workshop gave further examples of where to engage with people who are suffering in the epidemic of loneliness, to the plight of asylum seekers. Justice & charity is the mission of the Church today to make Christ's love known in the areas of housing & homelessness, domestic violence & its prevention; justice & equity for people seeking asylum, for aged care in the prison system; for the promotion of tax reform. The Church needs to be involved in promoting structural change in these areas. Joshua is the Executive Director at Catholic Social Services, Victoria. Where to engage will vary according to the different needs in different Parishes.

Archbishop Simon Poh Hoon Seng of the Archdiocese of Kuching, Malaysia, opened up for us the differences between Asian cultures & spirituality based on family & community to our individualistic culture & how we can respond to our migrants' needs. In Asian culture the individual serves the family. He said that when Asian families move into our parishes, it's important to welcome them & offer a sense of belonging because migrant Catholic families are a gift to our local parish families. He said that Christ invites us out of the doors of the church into the streets, because when we focus on our own image, we have lost the focus being on Christ who calls us to mission. The Catholic Church does not have a mission, but she is the mission of God to the world. The gift of so many in our presbyterate from these countries brings a wonderful richness & strength to our mission in the Archdiocese.

Jonathan & Karen Doyle are the founders & directors of Choicez Media which exists to support teachers & parents in the task of educating young people especially in the area of human sexuality & relationships. They spoke to us about missionary leadership. Karen stressed the importance of Presence & Spiritual Parenthood as the role we should have for our young people by being engaged in their lives & being with them in their pain & need. She said that while change is a given for all of us, growth is a choice, & that the Holy Spirit is the principle agent of the Church's mission who empowers us to make good choces. Karen stressed the importance of beginning with ourselves which involves rest, restoration, connection & creativity. Jonathan emphasised the need for vision & the need to empower others, all of which involves listening to God & to his people to discern where the Spirit is leading us to become the Body of Christ in our local neighbourhoods, which is what the Synodal process is about.

My final reflection would be what the Synod of the Amazon stressed – in our current model of being Church, we have made God too small – we need to seek God everywhere where God is breaking through in the goodness of people's lives & that we should celebrate that presence & action & support it & work to promote it so that the world may know through us, who claim to believe in God, God's love & power to renew the face of the earth.





Here I have set the boundaries of the sea.

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said:

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'

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# **Reflection** by Fr Michael Tate

Every element of the universe, even the most destructive, is listening for the voice of Our Lord, "Quiet, be still." In this Gospel story, the waters of chaos respond to the voice of the Lord of all creation, allowing Jesus to accompany his disciples to the other side of the Sea of Galilee.

We all know of times when chaos storms into our life, when we feel we are being swamped whether from outside or from some part of our own personality. Some part of our life is facing death. We may cry out to Jesus "Don't you care?".

He will come to accompany us but always to "the other side". Our Lord does not indulge the fantasy of "turning back the clock". We have to keep rowing in a new direction. There is no nostalgic return to the old situation. We may well feel displaced, disoriented, but Our Lord is our companion in the unfamiliar situation we have reached.

We could take a moment to pray for Our Lord to help us in all life-threatening situations, especially in the final transit through the wrenching chaos of death. May we hear him rebuke the Prince of Darkness and Death: "Quiet, be still" as he accompanies us to the other side, to the promised land of Heaven.
