BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

CONCERN FOR OTHERS

From time to time, we hear family counsellors speaking of the need for 'tough love', the sort of love that expresses itself by dealing head-on with the problems we are tempted to ignore. Often, we would do anything to avoid the risk of upsetting the other person. Of course, we all know that the problems are there but how do you go about confronting them in a constructive way? The readings for today give us some useful and powerful orientations.

As the people of Israel set up sentries to warn of the impending invasion by the Babylonians, Ezekiel was reminded of his own moral obligations as a sentry. His role was to speak the hard words of warning that would cause his contemporaries to rethink their values and get their inner house in order.

Matthew's own community had a process for naming issues and correcting them that respects both the individual and the community. If there is a problem in the community, its resolution needs to start on an individual level. Later, if it is necessary, the problem can be dealt with at the group level.

Paul highlights the obligation we have to each other in mutual love. Whether we warn each other as Ezekiel was called to do or correct someone, as was necessary in Matthew's community, it must come from our concern and love for the person. As he knows all too well it is only love that will not cause our brother or sister harm.



From the pen of the Parish Priest:

EFTPOS: We are in the process (much delayed) of getting two EFTPOS machines to make it easier to make your 'cash' thanksgiving donation or to buy from the Piety Stall.

We already have one temporary machine available at the Piety Stall (when it is open at 9:00 am and 10:30 am Masses on Sundays). You could make a general donation via that machine also if you wish.

Holy Water: If you use Holy Water at home you can either bring along a container that we can fill or if a small bottle is sufficient, you can take one of the small containers of water available in the sacristy.

Parish Forum: November 13th, 6:30 pm dinner provided.

The Parish Pastoral Council met last Tuesday. We want to broaden / deepen the roles/responsibilities of the council but that takes commitment by the parish as a whole—to agree to what roles are needed and for individuals in the parish to be willing to step up and be part of the council. I am keen, and the other Parish Pastoral Council members agree, that we need to grow into the future as a parish were we all take responsibility for the parish—a shared responsibility with a shared development and implementation of parish efforts to continue to be and to grow to be even more the presence of Jesus Christ for the world around us. The words used to capture these ideas is that we become synodal and co-responsible. Synodal—we walk together in faith and walk together seeking to be open to the call of the Holy Spirit. Co-responsible—we choose and set directions together and we step up and give our time, talent and treasure to achieve the things the parish needs to do.

At the forum on November 13th we want to put some flesh on these ideas, to get your comment, to get you involved.

One immediate consequence would be the refreshing of our Parish Council Membership and having someone with energy and gift and insight to come forwards able to take on being chair of the council.

The Joy of Christ: This week, I went to open up for a First Communion workshop. At the last moment I was asked to share something of my experience on the day of my ordination at a priest. (no Charles not 34 minutes, 3 or 4 minutes.)

I agreed readily, though I wasn't sure what to say. I spoke of five moments during the 1.5 hour ordination Mass: the moment of prostration (lying fully flat on the (cold) marble floor), waiting for the actual moment of my ordination, Archbishop Hart's hands on my head, the giving of the chalice and paten, and being at the main St Patrick's altar celebrating the Eucharist for the first time (with the Archbishop). Five specific moments of grace for me.

What astonished me after those few words was the comment by the leader "wow, did you see the joy in Fr Charles' face as he spoke of those moments? The way his face just shone with the joy of the moment: the grace remembered and brought present again?" People agreed, yes, they could see that special joy.

Please know: it's not just me—when you commit to Jesus Christ, when you allow the Holy Spirit space in your life—you will shine with that joy and that grace—not a selfish joy for self but God's grace shining for others to see. It's beautiful and it helps change the world around you. God bless, *Fr Charles*.
