

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

COME AND SEE

Samuel, in the first reading, hears a call in the night which he doesn't recognise. He is lying in the sanctuary of the Lord when his name is called. He is in the place where God dwells. He goes to Eli not once, but three times. Eli advises him to reply, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening" (1 Sam 3:9). Samuel had replied thrice to Eli, "Here I am", but the response to God was about listening.

The refrain of the Psalm (39:2), and a favourite hymn, echoes "Here I am." It renews our response to God as the psalm alerts us to God inclining and listening to us (v. 2).

The Gospel opens with John the Baptist and two of his disciples. John "looked at" Jesus walking by and said "See this is the Lamb of God" (John 1:36). Together the disciples follow Jesus. His turning around to ask what they want reveals that they seek to know where he abides. Jesus' reply, "Come and see", completes three versions of seeing. John's looking at and inviting others to see with him and Jesus also inviting them to come and see. Having seen and stayed with Jesus, one of them, Andrew, became a follower and brought his brother Simon Peter to Jesus. This coming, seeing and abiding with Jesus is the portraval of the call and the mission. The invitations today to listen, to come, to see and abide with Jesus are possible for each of us everyday as we turn our minds and hearts to the Word, our attention to God.

Stewardship / Thanksgiving

The Finance Group met on 10th January to start putting some flesh on a Stewardship/Thanksgiving campaign. Stewardship is about actively caring for the parish in all its facets. Thanksgiving is recognising God's gifts of faith and love and acting to support and grow those gifts.

Overall, our objective is to provide an opportunity for three things:

- 1. For you to have a chance to look into your heart, with Christ, and see how you are offering your talents for the greater glory of God. There are a lot of volunteer roles we need to fill: Parish Pastoral Council members and chair; Parish Finance Group; Members and Leaders for RCIA; Members for all ministry groups; People to start a Liturgy Group to help me devise and present the Mass and other liturgies in as Christ filled as possible.
- 2. For you have a chance to review how you are allocating your time: how much time is the 'right amount' now to consciously offer for our faith. Perhaps some might go to volunteering for the parish.
- 3. For you to have a chance to review your giving in money or giving as in-kind to support of the parish.

We published the Parish Report before Christmas, including a financial statement showing we are in a good financial situation for today. But ... we need to do more, hire staff to help us enact the things we want to do: on-going Alpha and Landings programs, better communications and reaching out to bring people to Jesus.

The start of this campaign will be in February with four weekends allocated for you to help update our database. You will be asked to fill in a Census card—the effort will be repeated for the four weeks so we cover as many people as possible. Once that is done, we hope to use other methods (e-mails, phone calls) to update the entire database (I am an optimist). This process will take a couple of months. The actual campaign proper won't start until August/September when we are coming out of Winter.

I look forward to your help to make this a successful campaign: first by being ready when February comes to fill in the Census card quickly, clearly, accurately.

God's Providence

A story! It happened to me last Thursday: I turned up at an aged care facility to celebrate Mass: mistaken arrangements had left me high and dry I wasn't expected, so I came back home early. Because I was home early, I responded to a call and went down early to open up for a funeral. Because I was there, I could also let in a family of three. Nothing to do with the funeral. All to do with ... needing Anointing and blessing because of a (sudden) major health crisis in the young man. I was there! Therefore, I was able to provide the Anointing and blessing and pray over the young man, and his family.

Random chance? Hmmm! No, not to me! That sequence is what I call "Providence", God's providence: I had to respond to the call but it was God's call, from what I had planned to what was needed for others.

NEED TO DISPOSE OF A VEHICLE?

Disposal of a car from a deceased estate, or when a family member has had to relinquish their licence or go into residential care, can be a challenging process. Getting a roadworthy, taking photos to advertise on the internet, cleaning and polishing, taking calls (if they come), even finding a garage until a prospective buyer turns up (if indeed they do!).

If you need to dispose of a vehicle from a deceased estate or which is no longer required, could you consider gifting it to the "Lifeboat Foundation", a registered charity with tax deductible status, which for ten years has been providing pastoral and practical support to nearly 150 victims/survivors across Australia of church-related sexual abuse.

Many of these suffer Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), have limited or no employment, and a donated vehicle could vastly improve their quality of life and/or generate funds to assist personal, medical and accommodation needs.
