

# **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

# I WILL NOT **LEAVE YOU ORPHANS**

One of the most touching phrases in John's Gospel is Jesus' promise before his death that he would not leave his disciples orphans. The quality of his presence among them would change after the resurrection. In the future the Spirit would be the one instructing, strengthening, and protecting disciples. Jesus promises that whoever receives his commandments will be loved by the Father. This promise is fulfilled when the Samaritans become believers through Philip's ministry of preaching and healing. Samaritans were considered heretical Jews, but their positive reception of the word prompted the Jerusalem community to think again and to send Peter and John to welcome them into the larger community. The gift of the Spirit through the laying on of hands is the sign of God's blessing and of their full incorporation into the growing Christian family.

The first letter of Peter was written in a time of great trial and opposition. How were Christians going to respond to false charges against them? How were they able to give a credible account of their Christian faith? These early Christians were urged to remain steadfast and true to their values and belief. Like them, we are encouraged to find our source of strength in the example of Jesus who suffered and died for us even though he was innocent. It is not an easy path we are asked to tread but we are encouraged to see that our best defence is the quality of our lives and the depth of our hope.

From the desk of ... the PP,

By the time you read these words I am back in Australia – spending some time in Perth (WA) – with by brother and with friends, some of whom I have known since 1977 when Tanya and I moved there and then decided to have children.

My mother came to visit – we had lived in Perth from 1956-1960 when we emigrated to Australia – and she didn't recognise the place. So very much had changed. As I get ready for my trip to begin in just 48 hours I find myself wondering what Perth will be like now since I haven't been there for fifteen years. A lot changes.

When we lived in Perth Tanya and I experienced an earthquake and the tail end of a cyclone. An engineer pointed out that the skyscrapers were built to US West-Coast standards but the earthquakes in Perth are totally different – the movements are different – the earth shakes differently. We can think ourselves all prepared but ... things change, new things arise.


How will Perth have changed this time? I don't know. I shall find out I suppose.

I know you've been in the capable hands of the priests who will provide supply for every weekend.

I had lunch with Fr Len Thomas and Fr Bill Gill on the Friday before I left on holiday. I know them both from before my ordination and after my ordination. Len remembers that he provided supply in St Kevin's when Gerry went on sabbatical for three months and apparently I diffidently asked him, as the newly ordained Permanent Deacon "do you mind if I preach at some of the Masses" — my memory is that he readily allowed me to. His memory is of the oddness that existed for him in not preaching. I am expecting to feel a little of that oddness in these weeks away as I shall not be preaching — at least not formally — and I love the preparation and delivery of the homily — truly a moment of grace for me.

The Permanent Diaconate is open to single and married men who want to serve God and the Church as ordained ministers.


