

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

CALLED TO HOPE

The readings for today are both comforting and unsettling. Isaiah's vision of the whole human family gathered in peace on the mountain of the Lord is one that all people of goodwill hope will one day come to pass. The Gospel, on the other hand, introduces a discordant and unsettling note as Jesus continues to confront his opponents with the disturbing parable of the wedding feast. It seems hardly fair that a poor man dragged off the street to make up the numbers at a wedding feast should then be cast out because he was improperly dressed. If Matthew is compared with Luke 14:15-24 it quickly becomes apparent that Matthew has combined two parables of Jesus regarding weddings. One spoke of guests who were invited but refused, the other spoke of someone who came to a wedding improperly dressed. Since Matthew's community comprised both Jewish and Gentile Christians it seems his aim was to make sure both groups avoided complacency and taking God's gracious invitation for granted.

As Paul reflects on his experience as an apostle, one thing he learned was that there was no room for complacency. The ministry he had received to preach the gospel was one which entailed many risks, poverty and plenty, acceptance and rejection. In order to preach the gospel, he worked to support himself but was often assisted by communities that he had established. As he nears the conclusion of the letter to the community in Philippi, he thanks them for their generosity and support.

World Youth Day Recap

In early August, we (Jane and Alfred) went on a pilgrimage to Fatima and participated in World Youth Day (WYD) which was held in Lisbon this year. WYD was formed by Saint John Paul II in 1984 and it is a gathering of young people from all over the world with the Pope.

Reflection from Alfred

The gospel of the final mass was the transfiguration and for me, WYD was the mountain that I had climbed with Jesus. For two weeks, I visited churches, went to mass, and did daily reflections and when it was time to go home, I wanted to stay and spend every day like this. But of course, I had to come down and return to my normal routine, so amid the busyness and distractions, it becomes a challenge to remember God in my daily life. However, our Holy Father understood the challenges that we will face, so when I remember his homily, calling us to shine, to listen and to be unafraid, it gives me hope because I am not alone in my struggle and my prayer is that the Holy Spirit can guide me to be with God every day.

I also want to encourage those who have children in grade 5 and above to consider sending them to World Youth Day 2027 in Seoul because they will be able to meet more than a million young people who share the same faith. While the young adults could plan their own schedule, the archdiocese prepared a structured program so that the high school students could experience a range of WYD activities in an organised way, and I saw that a great deal of thought and care went into the planning. Guided by an adult leader, they did everything in small groups and the leaders put in a lot of TLC to make sure their charges were alright, hydrated and coping with the crowd. The leaders carried extra water for their groups, reminded them to stay under the shade and the first aiders circled the groups checking on everyone. Because I've received so much grace from WYD, and I pray that if finances and time permit, the young people of St Gregory can discover a personal meaning of being Catholic and carry this conviction into adulthood.

Please know that at Fatima, we offered up the prayers that you had given to us by burning candles in the pyre and we would also like to thank Fr Charles and you, the parish community for your prayers and encouragement, your support means a great deal to us.
