
# OUR SUNDAY CELEBRATION

LOVE ONE ANOTHER. Today's Gospel comes from Jesus' Last Supper discourse. He is about to die. His final words to his beloved disciples are: 'as I have loved you, you also must love one another'. In the end, all that matters is love, a love that is expressed most purely when we sacrifice ourselves for the well-being of others. When we love in this way we show that we are disciples of Jesus who laid down his life for us.

# LITURGY OF THE WORD

#### FIRST READING

Acts 14:21-27

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them. Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### **ENCOURAGED BY LOVE**

It is the theme of encouragement offered and received which binds together the readings for today. As they make their way back to Antioch, Paul and Barnabas encourage the communities they have established among the Gentiles. On their return, they give an account to the community in Antioch of the fruitful ministry in which they have been engaged.

The reading from the Apocalypse is a vision that functions to encourage, comfort, and bring hope to a group of Christians who wondered whether God's plans for them and the world would ever reach fulfilment. Persecution had sapped their energies. Christians who had lost their initial fervour could not be blamed for wondering whether Jesus' death and resurrection had really changed the shape of the world. John's vision is a powerful answer to the questioning of Christians in every age.

One of the startling statements of Jesus in John's Gospel is that it is at the moment when he is betrayed, and seemingly powerless in the face of the forces of evil, that he is glorified. No one takes Jesus' life from him; it is freely offered out of love (John 10:18). It is precisely this love that serves as the foundation for the life of the Church, and as the means that leads to his glorification. It is our love of one another that gives us the encouragement we need and serves as the most powerful expression of our Easter faith for others.

# Words from Fr Charles:

# "Breakthrough"

The Parish Pastoral Council at St Gregory the Great is undertaking a strategic planning effort. We are looking to understand all the things that have been happening in the parish, to find whether they are still active/need to be restarted, to find if they are sufficiently supported, to find how they might be improved.

At the same time we are looking to find ways forward so that the parish can thrive and grow as a parish of missionary disciples.

If we are to respond to Jesus call, it is not possible that we stay as we are. We must seek to be well formed disciples, supporting each other. Disciples who are willing to look outwards and forwards.

To this end in our discussions we were asked to each bring along five "Breakthrough" ideas that would either improve our current situation greatly or provide ways in which we can become a parish which has an attitude of mind, heart and action which seeks to invite people to come to know Jesus Christ.

It is really hard to come up with "Breakthrough" areas a couple I felt might be appropriate are:

- Grow our music ministry to be even more alive and engaging across a broader swath of people.
- Grow our welcoming to go beyond "hello" and a cuppa after 10:30 am Mass –grow welcoming to be the start of a journey with people

Then I find it gets more difficult—and even those are easy to say but hard to do in a substantial way.

What are your thoughts? What practical things would you like to see to see happen and would be willing to help with? How can your efforts be better supported by the parish more broadly?
