

Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

SIGNS OF GOD IN THE TIMES

Reading accurately the signs of the times and then responding appropriately is seldom an easy matter. In coming to Mount Sinai, the people of Israel have arrived at a decisive moment, as today's first reading notes. They are called to remember how God rescued them and to pledge themselves to be faithful to their covenant relationship. By doing this each member will share in the priestly duties of bringing others to encounter the living God. Faced with the needs of so many people Jesus had also arrived at a moment of decision. The people were in desperate need of shepherds to care for them. His response was to appoint the Twelve to share in his ministry of healing and proclaiming the reign of God.

For Paul, the most important sign of the times was not the fact that all humanity deserved to be condemned as falling short of the mark. Rather, it was God's unexpected response to our need and powerlessness. Paul stresses our desperate plight in order to emphasise the marvellous gift we have been given in the saving death of Jesus. No greater proof could be found to show us God's love for all people than Jesus dying for us while we were yet sinners. From Paul's perspective, there was never a question of us meriting such an act of self-sacrifice. The death of Jesus is an invitation to wonder, hope and joyfully trust that whatever has ruptured our relationship with God has been healed.

Clergy Conference 2023:

I am preparing these words as the second day of the Clergy Conference draws near. The first day was focussed on the art of celebrating the Liturgy, the Mass. It took me a moment to remember the Latin term "Ars Celebrandi" but the speaker, Abbot Paul Gunter OSB, was excellent – bringing an inspired clarity to the reality that the Mass is more than saying, more than performing, more than celebrating, more than presiding, more than what is written in the prayers and the instructions in the Missal and Lectionary. In last Sunday's Homily I pointed to all the ways that Jesus the Christ is present to us. Abbot Paul drew these together even more closely than I did pointing out that in the Mass, in the Liturgy, all the things you and I do is an integral part of bringing Jesus Christ to be truly and fully present, with the culmination of course being that we receive the body and blood of Jesus the

It was a challenge to follow the breadth of what Abbot Paul presented – but well worth the concentration required. I am looking forward to the rest of the conference, especially the items named "Is a Homily a Speech" and "Nurturing Parish Musicians."

Welcoming! We have a new Welcoming Group: but still: if <u>you</u> see someone you DON'T know? go up and have a chat and get to know them.


