BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

GOD OPEN TO NEW WAYS

For the people of Israel, Isaiah's words about all nations coming to worship in Jerusalem would have been a source of great disquiet, consternation, and surprise. Surely, they were the chosen people and as such stood apart from the nations that surrounded them. It is perhaps difficult for us to imagine their horror at the idea that Gentiles would have the effrontery to worship in the Lord's own temple in Jerusalem. Isaiah goes further and points out that all this will happen with God's blessing.

Paul speaks at a time when Gentiles had come to accept Jesus, but many Jews had not. His problem was to work out how this possibly fits into the tapestry of God's saving plan. He came to see that by means of Israel's non-acceptance, a way was opened for the Gentiles. This would serve as a prompt for other Jews to accept Jesus and so pave the way for the general resurrection of the dead.

The Canaanite woman shouting out to Jesus clearly unhinged the disciples. In the first place, they were in Gentile territory, in the second place she was advertising to all and sundry that Jesus and his companions were Jewish, in the third place Jesus seemed to be turning a deaf ear to the woman's request. Ultimately both the disciples, and Matthew's readers must come to terms with the fact that faith, and God's response to it, recognises no boundaries. The loving mother's persistence and faith will have its just reward.

From the Desk of ... Fr Charles:

Gates & Seniors Parking: Yippeee! The new gates are now functionally operative but are locked open until we can finalise some programming for access, who has access, how access is given. It's taken an age. The plan initially is to have the gates open 6 am—10:00 am and 2:00 pm to 10 pm during the week and open 6 am to 10 am on weekends—or times close to that. It will probably be another three weeks before we start actually closing the gates for periods.

As part of finishing the gates, we moved seniors parking. The two spaces immediately outside the church have been eliminated and two new spaces created just down hill of the main doors. Two additional general spaces have been created on the other side of the drive, retaining the accessibility spaces in the middle and the two seniors spaces at the top on the far side.

Masks: I have been wearing a mask during distribution of Communion and also encouraging others assisting with distributing Communion to do so. The reason: that is in my assessment a key contagion point. Recently most aged care facilities have moved to not requiring masks. This says to me that the risk profile has changed and my caution is no longer needed. Consequently: I shall no longer be wearing a mask during distribution of Communion, an probably other ministers will not wear them either. If you would rather that I/they continue wearing a mask—please speak up—let me know—and the masks will resume.
