

# SECOND READING

Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

# **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

# FAITH SEEKING UNDERSTANDING

St Anselm defined theology as faith seeking understanding. As people of faith, we seek to understand and respond to how God's plan is unfolding in our own lives. One of the most difficult hurdles for a person of faith to overcome is coming to terms with the fact that proclaiming the will of God can lead to persecution and suffering. The first reading and the Gospel address this challenge calling us to be steadfast and faithful in times of persecution and rejection. Jeremiah's natural response to persecution was calling on God to intervene and avenge him in the present. When Jesus commissioned the disciples, they were invited to respond in a different way. Disciples of every age are called to trust that our present faithfulness in times of persecution will not be forgotten or go unrewarded.

One of the tasks that faced Paul was teasing out and explaining to his contemporaries how Jesus' suffering and rejection fitted into God's saving plan. What looked like disaster and failure he had come to see as the dawn of a new age. Comparing Jesus to Adam provided Paul with the means to share his understanding that what had been lost by Adam's sin had now finally been regained, and more than regained, through the death of Jesus. God did not avenge Jesus' death but transformed a moment of violence into the most extraordinary moment of grace. Disciples are called to not only understand this mystery but let it penetrate our lives in times of suffering and rejection.

<u>New Gates</u>: much progress but still not finished! By the start of term 3 (10th July) we anticipate being well into the commissioning phase of works. Once the gates are operating, you will nearly always arrive to see the gates open.

We will give you the details of operation before beginning their use.

Morning Teas: These are a great opportunity to catch up. Please read the notice! 30 mins after 10:30 Mass. And: It's easy! A parishioner did the tea recently: no training: it worked! Not difficult. She said! Please volunteer!

<u>Childsafe/Safeguarding</u>: Are our safeguarding requirements onerous to meet? Or at least do they seem onerous? If they are or if you think they are then please let us know: email or call the office.

Yes, we expect far more than ten years ago—but once initial checks are done (yes, that can be a little tortuous), the load drops dramatically to be a routine—small effort to engender a deeply child-safe culture./

<u>St Vinnies Winter Appeal</u>: we left out their AD last week—don't miss the <u>link</u> that is included so you can donate on line.

Support Group: I put out a report before I went on holidays. That was two and a half months ago. We have not been sitting idle in the intervening weeks. We have been discussing how we might seek to better organise the work of the parish to enable me to focus my time more effectively for you and for the future. We have had one consultation session and we will have a joint Parish and Finance council gathering on 25th July to discuss our ideas. Then we'll be having broader discussions—with you. Two parishes: more effectively operating—more focussed on being disciples of Jesus Christ.

<u>Ukrainian Refugees:</u> Archbishop Peter has asked parishes if they might contribute some money (perhaps \$10,000/yr for 3 yrs) to help refugees of the Ukranian Catholic Church with their mental health and employment training. Government funding has stopped now the media coverage has dropped. I think this is a good idea: **what do you think? Please let me know**.


