

#### BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

#### THE ANNUNCIATION

On the eve of Christmas, today's Gospel reminds us of how the birth of Jesus is possible. Luke's narrative describes God sending the Angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee. It is a familiar story to us, yet nothing of it is in our realm of experience.

This event is reported in a series of stories paralleling the annunciation and birth accounts of John the Baptist and Jesus. The narrative will present John as herald of the arrival of Jesus as Messiah when the time of his public ministry arrives, fulfilling God's promise.

Rightly this is an account of God's activity via Gabriel announcing first to Zechariah and then to Mary. Here is a moment bathed in God's grace. God's incarnation will occur in a natural human manner, born of a woman. Yet take a focus on Mary and imagine again the appearance of an angel. No surprise that she might be perplexed (Luke 1:29). Yet Mary responds, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." (v. 38).

Mary also hears of her cousin Elisabeth's fortunate conception and sets off to see her. Their meeting, the centrepoint of the double annunciations and births, reveals these two women in embrace, together they usher in the birth of the Son of God. Today, the focus is on Mary's embrace of her mission but she is part of a larger story, God's story. Mary is a courageous woman who in the face of an impossible challenge steps forward in faith.

Assistant Priest: Suddenly – an offer I have accepted – the appointment of an assistant.



Welcome to Fr Isaac Ad Hani Moheib Fayez Zaki! Sometime soon, hopefully just after Christmas Fr Isaac (Isaac) will join the Doncaster and the Templestowe parishes as Assistant Priest. I have met Isaac and he is a lovely man. Please welcome him warmly when he arrives.

A significant part of his time will be spend as Chaplain caring for the Egyptian Coptic Catholic Community. Beyond that we will work over coming weeks out how best Isaac minister with us.

Isaac is about 40 and has been ordained for 13 years, serving in various roles in Egypt and spent five 'holiday's in Canada providing supply for the Coptic priest in Ontario.

I spend an afternoon with Isaac and found him to be engaging, insightful, knowledgeable, faith-filled. I think he will prove to be a gift of the Holy

I ask your help to make sure, as a new migrant (he's been here 12 days), Isaac gets the best induction to our ways, our culture, our approach to faith: all the perplexity of a new country and parish.

Being Prophetic: Last week I spoke in my homily about the reality that we are all gifted by the Holy Spirit with the capacity to speak prophetically. Here is the process I outlined:

Recognise that you are receiving a call of the Holy Spirit to speak out or take action – that good but disturbing feeling or urge to speak out about God's call. Recognise and respond.

Centre in God – allow yourself time. Time to be quiet, time to just 'be still' with God.

Sense the call you are seeking to respond to. Allow an image to form. If that doesn't feel / seem right, allow another image. Allow yourself to sit with the

Relate your image to a passage from Scripture – there is no 'rule' here – choose the passage that you sense to be right. And allow a word to arise from it.

Ask why this image / scripture /word? Allow space for the Holy Spirit Allow the image, scripture, Word to settle and point you to an action that you can take that can be applied in the real world.

Christmas: Jesus is born Alleluia, Alleluia. I pray your Christmas, New Year, and holidays are filled with grace and blessing and joy and love and ways forward into God's Grace and Love. 
