Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY

One of the duties of a king in the ancient world was that of being the judge of the highest court in the land and the last court of appeal for anyone seeking justice. In the readings for today, we are invited onto a large stage to witness a drama in which the lives of individuals, nations, and all forms of authority and power, must stand before God's judgement.

In Ezekiel, the cries and suffering of the people have not gone unnoticed by God. The religious leaders had proved themselves to be unworthy and God will now provide the care and leadership that had been entrusted to them. Using the beautiful image of the shepherd who shelters, comforts, and heals, Ezekiel shows how God's judgement and rule are accompanied by loving care for those who suffer.

For his part, Paul reflects on the role of Jesus in the larger scheme of salvation history. The resurrection of the Lord had convinced him that a new age, a new creation was dawning. Jesus had been exalted as Lord and King and his rule would last until death had been conquered. Then he will offer a renewed creation back to God the source of all.

The fascinating development in the Gospel passage is that we are called to share in the development and growth of the kingdom by means of our loving concern for others. The responsibility of caring for the flock is one in which we are all called to share, and it is on this basis that we will be judged.

Advent:

This Sunday is the Feast of Christ the King – the culmination of 34 weeks of journeying from Christmas through Easter to the end of times – the resurrection – the second coming. And so the cycle begins again. We aren't going in a circle though – it seems that way as we go through the years but in reality we are on a continual journey with Christ towards the fullness of the Kingdom of God. Each and every day we all move along the trajectory set by Jesus away from living in a world lost to sin and towards living in a world filled with God's love.

Advent begins the liturgical cycle again – we move into the Gospel of Mark – the shortest, the first of the Gospels. The most urgent! The most incisive! The most challenging!

This is the Gospel which begins the Good News of Jesus Christ, Son of God and ends ... handing the story on to you and I to continue.

We've set the times for an advent Reconciliation Service (at St Kevin's, with priests to provide absolution) and for all the Christmas Masses. The calendar will be published next week.

Please join me on this part of our journey – hopefully I won't catch Covid-19 on Christmas Eve this year (what a blow for me, though also what a moment of grace because it reminded me strongly how important it is to me to celebrate Christmas with you.)

Bringing People to Jesus - Ron Huntley

Over sixty people gathered on 22nd November to listen to Ron Huntley and discuss what it means to be disciples and to be disciples who go and make disciples. Attendance was 1/3rd St Kevin's and 2/3rds St Greg's. To have this many people turn up is amazing: thank you to everyone who came and made the evening such a success.

We had allowed for 40% Ron talking and 60% discussion and questions: it wasn't enough. We sought permission to go beyond our planned finish time of 8:00 pm. And that wasn't enough. Tiziana as MC had to call a halt or I think we would have been there till 10:00 pm. We ended with Ron praying for all of us in St Greg's and St Kevin's parishes and closed at 8:20 pm but ... people wanted to talk and share and find out more so my support team and I were only able to start de-briefing with Ron at 8:50 pm and didn't finish that till 9:20 pm. There was so much to share and discuss.

The night was a success – thank you to all who made it so.

Three actions from the Parish Assembly (a report is in preparation) and the night with Ron are:

- We will go forwards with seeking to hire a couple of extra staff to help ensure that all the work of the parishes can be led effectively. Advertising will resume in the New Year as we have missed the window and Advent/Christmas/Holidays get in the way till then.
- We will go forwards with a pilot of the Alpha program in February/ March to build our knowledge so we can run Alpha on an on going basis from next year.
 - Alpha seeks to help people share a meal for a few weeks and in the process open themselves to a personal encounter with Jesus Christ it's fun and friendly and enlivening and over time we will invite everyone to participate—we regulars, those who are less connected, those who have no faith, even those who are maybe a bit anti-faith: everyone!
- We will go forwards with a Landings effort in February Landings seeks to give people who are pondering a return a safe, gentle, open space to discuss why their faith has wavered or fallen away and perhaps how to return to faith and to the faith community

There will be lots more action required as we seek to both draw people to Jesus and to enliven even further all our existing amazing ministries.
