# **Monsignor Tony writes**

Dear friends.


Well we have had a bit of an emotional rollercoaster over the last week haven't we? Most people expected an easing of restrictions on the gatherings of people and many school families and teachers would have been looking forward to enjoying the start of the school holidays and perhaps a meal with the extended family for a nice catch-up.

In our parish, we would have liked to have been able to welcome 50 people to each Mass. We had planned to have Thursday and Friday Masses with a class of school children and that is why we were changing to 9.30am. However, it was not to be and so our Masses have stayed at 8am.

This week and next week, during the school holidays, our weekday Masses will be at 9am Tuesday to Friday. This is because the school COVID drop off system will not be operating. We will resume 8am Masses on Tuesday 14 July.

Our first Sunday Mass will be at 8.30am on Sunday. At the time of typing this note to you, there are thirty six people wanting the twenty places at 8.30am Mass. 5pm Mass will be comfortably full and there are similar bookings for 10.30am Mass.

Our people have experienced various levels of anxiety over these last months. And some have been frustrated that their freedoms have been restricted. Some of our parishioners have been concerned that they cannot come into church. However, everything we have been experiencing was brought into relief/perspective when I saw this article. All those people will never walk into church again and each one died in a painful or uncomfortable way.

At mass on Sunday the Archbishop of Lima, Carlos Castillo, looked out over a cathedral full of faces - none of them alive.

The cleric had his church filled with more than 5,000 portraits of those who have died in the pandemic that is spreading across Peru, using his broadcast homily to criticise a health system he said was "based on egotism and on business and not on mercy and solidarity with the people".
