When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.


Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome -Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

FOSTERING COMMUNITY

The great feast of Pentecost is traditionally understood as a celebration of the birth of the Church. The outpouring of the Spirit empowered the first disciples to engage in their ministry of preaching the word of Jesus and continue the work of building a community of faith. The presence of devout Jews from throughout the known world is a signal to Luke's Christians that the message that has been entrusted to them is to be shared with the wider world. Paul was at the forefront of preaching the word and establishing new communities throughout the Eastern Mediterranean world. He knew that the gifts of the Spirit had been abundantly poured upon the community of Corinth but there were some in the community who started to look down on those who had received gifts different from their own. Imagine his consternation when the gifts which were meant to build up the unity of the community had become a sign of its division! Paul's response is to use the image of the parts of the body as a means of overcoming division, competition, arrogance, and envy.

John knew that the gift of the Spirit is one that both builds up the community and commissions it for mission. It is a gift that encourages and strengthens us for the road ahead. Two elements necessary to foster community are stressed in today's Gospel: firstly, that of building up the community through forgiveness and secondly, protecting it by retaining sins when necessary, and indicating to members of the community when their behaviour is destructive of the community.

From the desk of Fr Charles:

People Needed:

Expectations: Last weekend, Jesus set a high bar for us: "Go and make disciples of all nations." This weekend he leaves us with no excuses: although it is the apostles who are most spoken about as going out and speaking and being understood by people from all over the world, it is the whole believing community that is present at the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. We receive that same Spirit in our Baptism and Confirmation.

So, Jesus expects a lot of us. But he doesn't expect us to be foolish. I am always asking for people to help with things. I don't do so lightly, but it might be that I ask too much, or start pushing rather than inviting. You have a responsibility as a follower of Jesus Christ to give of your time, your talents/gifts/abilities/call, and your treasure/ skills/money/goods: so please do give, volunteer, help, offer what you can even when it means giving up something else. But there must be

One area of parish effort where balance is essential is in how the broader parish works with our schools. I meet regularly with our three school Principals and our conversations are open and trusting so we were able to have a constructive conversation about expectations. We agreed the following:


- 1. Meet with me on a fortnightly basis
- 2. Ensure that the sacramental program is effectively supported (without expecting principals to be present at all sacraments)
- 3. Be an active part of the Parish Pastoral Councils
- 4. Contribute to Safeguarding, this can involve attending meetings, but no more than once a term.
- 5. Provide each other with advice when needed Help me ensure the faith formation of staff and students These expectations don't define everything that might be asked of our principals and our schools, but they set boundaries so that they can manage their multitudinous responsibilities in school and their broader lives, so that I don't and we don't get unreasonable. We may not see our principals at every parish event or sacrament: they will be that doesn't mean they are not helping grow the parish and helping evangelise.

You? Yes, like Jesus, I have high expectations of you – please, offer yourselves or offer yourselves again to help to keep our parish thriving and growing and alive with the Holy Spirit. God bless, Fr Charles
