When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome -Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God.

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

COMMUNICATING OUR FAITH

Through the gift of the outpouring of the Spirit, the first disciples were empowered to preach the message of Jesus in language that could be understood by all. To this day Pentecost remains a model for the continuing life of the Church as we seek to speak meaningfully to the people of our own time.

One of Paul's greatest strengths as an apostle was his creativity and tireless search to communicate, in contemporary language, the meaning and consequences of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Like a cutter of precious stones, he was always bringing new facets to light, always searching for new ways to explain and communicate what he believed. He knew that Pentecost was only experienced by a chosen few and yet all Christians had been baptised into the love of Father, Son and Spirit. The gift of the Spirit enables all of us to call on God as Abba, as Father, sharing in the inheritance and promises of Christ himself. With this gift comes the call to respond and for Paul, this means leaving our enslaved past behind. Since the Spirit has made a home in us, we should live accordingly.

Similarly, the Gospel calls us to actualise the gift of the Spirit we have received through our faithfulness to Jesus' command to love one another. That first Pentecost the disciples spoke in ways that could be understood by all. The simplest and most powerful language we have is being faithful to Jesus' command to love one another.

Words from Fr Charles:

Pentecost!

Thank you for journeying through the Lenten and Easter Seasons with me. Today, Pentecost Sunday, we remember and are caught up in the presence of the Holy Spirit leading us, guiding us, calling us, inspiring us.

With the Ascension we are given charge of the mission to go and make disciples, to spread the good news of God's love for us. With Pentecost we are given the inspiration to be capable of going out to the world and being heard. What a privilege!

Now ... what happens?

You are already giving of your time, talent and treasure—I may not see all of you giving but I know it is true. How might we grow in this journey? Five questions might be useful as we seek to live our mission as a faithful Christian community. Am I / are we:

- 1. A worshipping community? Truly Active, engaged, present?
- 2. Growing in faith; as followers of Jesus Christ?
- 3. Growing our lives so that we are serving the will of the Father?
- 4. Spending time to build our relationships as a community? Are we reaching out and actively connecting with others?
- Giving in a spirit of gratitude for God and the graces given to us freely? Giving generously so that we can reach out to those who have not yet responded to the Good News?

If we can say Yes Yes Yes Yes Yes then we have every chance of overcoming the effects of the pandemic, overcoming disinterest, draw people to come and know Jesus Christ's love.

I listened to a recent episode of "God Forbid" the comment was made that we. people of faith, are irrelevant to most young people—yet a comment was also made that young people are intensely interested in the meaning of life. This truth is borne out by my recent experience during a Q&A with some of our grade 3/4 children. Their questions to me ranged from "Who made God?" to "How did God raise Jesus from the dead?" to "How can Jesus be bot god and man?" to "how did Jesus come to be?"

If children today have such urgent, penetrating questions, surely adults must too. We are not irrelevant if we step up and fill this thirst to know of God and God's love. It's not simple. It's not easy. It is essential.

Be sealed with the Holy Spirit, Alleluia Alleluia!!!
